

Glam Clam Quilt Class Information

I'm looking forward to meeting all of you for our Glam Clam Quilt class. This document details a bit of pre-work and a few ideas to make our class more effective. Also there are a few pages of layout ideas and a coloring page. The class is designed for you to make either the 8" or 12" Glam Clam. Save the 6" to play with after the class! If this is your first time sewing curves, then I suggest the 12". It is much easier!

Download the Glam Clam pattern for free off of Craftsy. You can choose either the 8" version: http://www.craftsy.com/pattern/quilting/home-decor/glam-clam-quilt-8/61605 or the 12" version: http://www.craftsy.com/pattern/quilting/home-decor/glam-clam-quilt-12/61623. Ignore piecing instructions because those have changed - just reference the layout information.

Both patterns include baby through king sized layouts and you can make any size that you would like. Note that the only quilts that *may* be finished in class will be a baby sized quilt and maybe the lap sized. But, you will get a lot done on larger sizes and will go home confident enough in the technique to be able to finish your quilt easily.

Pre-Work

Your pre-work before class is to cut out your whole clamshells. This can take awhile and I don't want your whole class to be spent cutting out clamshells. If you can't cut them all out, then at least cut out the first three rows. We will cut out the peripheral shapes - sides, top, bottom, etc during class.

The free pattern listed above contains paper templates. I've also developed an acrylic template that can be used for cutting called The Clammy in either the 12" or 8" sizes. I don't have an online store set up yet but, you can purchase them in Los Angeles from Sew Modern at 10921 Pico on the West-side. Layout

If you need layout assistance, feel free to cut out enough to start to lay your quilt out and we will work on layout in class before you start to sew. On the next few pages are some layout ideas for you to think about. Also, there is a coloring sheet for your use.

Supplies for Class

Supplies:

Fabric requirements vary by size and are included in the pattern Coordinating thread for piecing 28mm Rotary Cutter - if you're going to use The Clammy Cutting Mat Acrylic Ruler Fabric Scissors - if you're using paper templates A few straight pins

Optional Supplies: 1/4" foot for your sewing machine Knee lift - if your machine has one bring it Stiletto (like The Purple Thing)

Glam Clam Layout Options

There are MANY options for the layout of your Glam Clam quilt! On this page are a few Glam Clams that I have made. On the next page are a few more ideas. On the last page there is a coloring page where you can play and come up with your own layouts!

On the Glam Clam to the right which was designed for Robert Kaufman, clams are grouped with like colors with pops of brights.








These two pattern cover quilts are both scrappy, scrappy! Scrappy is fun and easy and a great layout option for Glam Clam quilts! Neon and Neutral on the left has a strategic selection of tan neutral fabrics with pops of neon yellow, red and blue. First Kiss on the right is just a fun scrappy quilt.

More Layouts

Ombre!!!!! Enough said. Each successive row includes a slightly darker color. Can be made with prints or solids.


Ombre again. But, this time, every other row has a background color behind it.






Scrappy again with a limited color pallette. Once again, every other row is a white background fabric. This is a classic look that a lot of traditional clamshell quilts utilize.

This is a combination of the Kona Glam Clam as well as alternating rows with a background fabric.
