

WESTSIDE QUILTERS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING JANUARY 9, 2016

A meeting of the Executive Board of Westside Quilters was held on January 9th, 2016 at the home of Sally Wright. President Perla Rothenberg welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 10:10 a.m. Other Officers attending were Sally Wright, Tina Nord, Luann Jaffe, Debbie Nussbaum, Roberta Walley, Karynn Dittmar, Sue Woods, Hilary Smith, and Lisa Drew.

The motion to approve the minutes of the October 31^{st,} 2015 Executive Board Meeting was made by Sally Wright, seconded by Hilary Smith, and approved by all.

President's Report: Perla talked about the donation of the HandiQuilter 16 to the Guild. Hillary picked it up from San Diego and is storing it. It did not come with a frame. Tina expressed concern over the tax deduction letter for the donor and the amount the donor wanted stated on the letter. Questions were raised about the actual value of the machine. Tina will call a CPA and an attorney for advice and Perla will research the current value. Upcoming Board position vacancies were discussed. Vice President Debbie Nussbaum is in charge and a search committee will be formed.

Vice President's Report: Debbie Nussbaum talked about the positions that will be open when current Board members term-out. She will privately contact Board members who have served one year to see if they wish to remain on the Board for the second year. Debbie is unable to attend the Council meeting of the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds. Aileen Cooke is attending. Debbie and the Program Committee will be going to the SCCQG 'Meet the Teacher' event on April 9th.

Membership Report: Karynn Dittmar talked about the 'Bring a Friend for Free" promotion for the February Quarterly Meeting. A motion to approve this was made by Karynn, seconded by Sally Wright and approved by all. This will be announced in the upcoming Newsletter.

Website / Social Media: Sally Wright has moved the newsletter archive to the 'Members Only' section of the website.

Treasurer's Report: Tina Nord reported that the cash balance is currently \$5082. We are still waiting for Culver City to refund a \$300 deposit from 2015. Room rentals, at St. John's Presbyterian and St. Andrew's Lutheran, have been paid through May. The Holiday Tea generated \$351 in donations from members. \$149 was added to this amount from the general funds and a donation of \$500 was made to the St. Augustine's charity. Luke Haynes is owed \$1100 for fees for the workshop and General Meeting in February and some minor expenses. There are 18 paid registrants for the workshop with the possibility of additional registrations. The checks for Mark Lipinski cleared on January 4th.

Fred Zerez will send his recommendations for the new microphone/sound system to Tina. It will be ordered through Amazon Prime and will not exceed \$250.

Tina will send out 1099s to speakers paid more than \$600 in 2015, and a letter to members who contributed \$25 or more to WQ in 2015.

Newsletter: Luann Jaffe stated that the deadline for the February Newsletter would be January 26th or 27th, after Road to California.

Philanthropy: Hilary Smith reported that approximately 75 quilts were delivered to the St. Joseph's Center, Para Los Niño's and Las Familias. Photographs are on the website and will be in the upcoming Newsletter. There are still Wounded Warrior quilts to be donated and some children's quilts to be finished.

Programs: Roberta thanked Lisa Drew for hosting the Holiday Tea and Hilary Smith, Sue Woods and Carol Kapuscinski for organizing the Philanthropy workshop and the delivery of the quilts.

Sally Wright talked about upcoming programs. So far 14 members have signed up for the UFO workshop on January 16th. There will be a potluck salad lunch with attendees asked to bring a salad for approximately 8 people. Drinks and dessert will be provided. Sally requested paper goods and cutlery. Debbie volunteered to help set-up.

The Luke Haynes workshop is technically sold out at 20 registrants. Luke has said he is able to accommodate a few more people so an email will be sent out.

At present there is not a Showcase Speaker scheduled for the February Quarterly meeting. Suggestions were welcomed and Vicki Fisher-Lerer was mentioned. Sally will contact Vicki.

Registration for the March workshop will be opened shortly and Sally, Roberta, and Kathryn Pellman are working on filling the workshop schedule through 2017.

Upcoming Executive Board meetings will be held at the home of Sally Wright on Saturday February 27th and April 2ndat 10am.

The meeting was adjourned at 11.15 a.m.
