Our Saturday, May 2 meeting will be a not-to-miss event!



patterns and designs they thought they could never do. Participants in the workshop took shapes and lines and created wonderful works of art.





WESTSIDE QUILTERS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING MARCH 21, 2015

A meeting of the Executive Board of Westside Quilters was held on March 21st, 2015 at the home of Sally Wright.

President Perla Rothenberg welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 10:15. Other Officers attending were Sally Wright, Tina Nord, Lisa Redmond, Debbie Nussbaum, Roberta Walley, Tanya Heldman and Lisa Drew.

The motion to approve the minutes of the February 7th Quarterly Meeting was made by Sally Wright, seconded by Lisa Drew and approved.

President's Report: Perla talked about the Board of Directors. The current board is Patrick Ela, Fred Zerez and Barbara Harrison. Fred and Patrick are no longer able to serve. Potential replacements were discussed and will be contacted to see if they are interested and willing to serve.

Philanthropy: Debbie Nussbaum and Tanya Heldman reported that there are still quilts coming in from the November Philanthropy workshop. The Board approved the annual \$500 budgeted charitable donations for this fiscal year: \$300 to Las Familias del Pueblo, and \$200 to St. John's Presbyterian Church.

Vice President's Report: Roberta Walley talked about the guild's April 18th docent led tour of the Man-Made exhibition at the Craft & Folk Art Museum. Leadership was discussed. Some members are finishing their two-year term and there are positions open on the Board. Roberta thanked and congratulated Debbie and Tanya for their Philanthropy leadership.

Membership Report: Sally Wright reported that there is one new guild member, Sharon Kelm, bringing the current total to 88. Renewals will begin at the May 2nd Quarterly Meeting. A reminder to renew will be published in the April newsletter and there will be renewal forms on the chairs at the meeting and also one published in the May newsletter.

Newsletter: The deadline for the April newsletter was set at March 26th. Lisa Redmond talked about request to generate a paper newsletter for mailing. It was decided this is not feasible.

Treasurer's Report: Tina Nord reported that the checking account balance is currently \$4704. There had been an issue with the \$200 donation made to the California Vets. Both the initial, and subsequent replacement check, have not been cashed resulting in stop-payment fees. It was agreed not to pursue the donation any further. Tina talked about preparing the budget for the next fiscal year. Items noted from the current fiscal year results were the shortfall in membership - \$4380 vs \$5000 expected, donations were greater than expected - \$1510 vs. \$1100 expected, workshop registration had a greater loss than expected with two workshops still to go, and quarterly meeting expenses are running over budget. Options for controlling workshop expenses were discussed. A motion to put forward new guidelines was made. This included requiring that speakers stay at a member's home instead of a hotel unless there are special circumstances, a cap of \$70 for a workshop fee unless special circumstances, and that speaker contracts need to be presented to the Board before being signed. The motion was moved by Sally Wright, seconded by Perla Rothenberg and approved by all.

Programs: Removing one day of the Mark Lipinski program due to lack of interest in a two day program was discussed. Looking into new speakers for Quarterly Meetings and changing up some of the workshops were also discussed.

The next Executive Board meeting will be held at the home of Sally Wright on Sunday, April 26th at 10am. The meeting was adjourned at 12:30.
