WESTSIDE QUILTERS QUARTERLY GENERAL MEETING – February 6, 2016

The general meeting of Westside Quilters (WQ) was held on February 6, 2016at St. John's Presbyterian Church.

Introductory Remarks: President Perla Rothenberg brought the meeting to order at 10.05a.m.Perla welcomed everyone to the first meeting of 2016. Guests present were Melissa, Krista, Gwen, Rain, KC, Julie and Linda. A special welcome was extended to Veronica Gray, and one of the Directors of Westside Quilters, Luisa Del Giudice

Minutes: A motion to pass the minutes of the October 31st, 2015 meeting was made by Perla, seconded by Betsy Barker and Sandy Ray and approved by all.

Treasurer: The current bank balance is \$4132.

Vice President: Debbie Nussbaum talked about being inspired by the quilts and workmanship she had seen in person at Road to California, and online on the website Pinterest. Debbie will be recruiting members to fill vacant Executive Board positions. She thanked Perla for serving as President, which is one of the positions that will be open this year. Debbie encouraged members to think about becoming more involved with the Guild and serving on the Board.

Programs: Sally Wright thanked Luke Haynes for the contemporary Log Cabin workshop that had taken place the day before. Three upcoming workshops are now open and members were encouraged to sign up at the meeting. The Kathryn Pellman "Fashionistas – Paper Dolls for Grownups " workshop will take place on March 12th. On April 16th Cindy Myers, a certified Judy Niemeyer instructor, will teach her Cactus Star paper pieced table runner workshop. On May 13th, Jerry Granata will present "Quilting with Unusual Fabrics".

Showcase Speakers: Westside Quilters' Roberta Walley, and Philanthropy Co-Chairs, Hilary Smith, Sue Woods and Carol Kapuscinski, spoke about delivering the charity quilts made by WQ members this year. Roberta first congratulated Hilary, Sue, and Carol for such a successful year and then spoke about the delivery to St. Joseph's Center in Venice. The Center serves the local community with a food pantry, a culinary school, and a preschool. There are approximately 35 kids enrolled in the preschool. Carol talked about the deliveries to Las Familias and Para Los Ninos, centers that serve children in Downtown Los Angeles. Approximately 75 quilts were delivered.

WQ member, Pat Karasick spoke about Quilts From the Heart, a group that meets the second and fourth Friday of the month at the Mar Vista Library. Quilts From the Heart was started in 2004 and makes quilts for charity. They make at least 200 quilts a year using donated fabric. They raise money from a once a year sale to purchase batting. The group promotes education and the members learn a variety of techniques making sampler quilts. Pat encouraged WQ members to join.

Show and Tell: Marianne Simpson showed her quilt top from the Luke Haynes workshop and a scrap Log Cabin quilt that incorporated fabrics from 36 different projects she has made. She also showed 2 pillows made using wool – "Love One Another" and "Fall Pumpkins and Crow". Virginia Marshall showed "Bricks" made from a pattern by Kaffe Fassett using his fabrics. Sandy Ray showed her "Homage to Kaffe Fassett". Kathryn Pellman shared "Poetry Fashionista" and "Fashionista Foodies". Bobbie Leung shared her Log Cabin project from the Luke Haynes workshop. Debbie Nussbaum showed her double-sided "Singapore Sweets" workshop quilt and "Running Girl- Celebrate Joy" inspirational quilt.

Other Business: Perla reminded the Guild of the upcoming QuiltCon taking place in Pasadena February 18th – February 21st.2116. Featured Speaker: Kathryn Pellman introduced our Featured Speaker, Luke Haynes. Luke presented "Architextiles" a fascinating and informative lecture and slide show talking about his quilting journey. Luke began sewing in an 8th Grade elective class where he made a hat that he wore for the next year. He also had an early love of knitting and crochet. He attended art school and made his first quilt approximately 13 years ago – "Self Portrait #1" which was made using 8" squares his Mom had acquired at a yard sale. The quilt ended up being 7x10 feet. He attended Architecture school and began to make quilts based on portraits of friends. This evolved into commissions and then showings of his work. Series of Luke's quilts include "Man Stuff" and "American Nostalgia". Luke talked about some of the artists who have influenced him, including Chuck Close whose use of grid work for his paintings inspired Luke to make his quilts one piece at a time. Other influences have been Kehinde Wiley, a painter and conceptual artist, Edward Hopper, architect, Shigeru Ban, and Donald Judd whose work and installations in Marfa, TX inspired Luke's current project. We saw some of Luke's quilts in person and many more through the slide show. His current project, "The Log Cabins of Donald Judd" consists of 50 quilts showing different interpretations of the traditional log cabin quilting method. The quilts are all made with fabric from Goodwill and include only red centers and black and white fabrics. The exhibition will be at Crafted at the Port beginning February 18th.

Perla thanked Luke and the meeting was adjourned at 12.10.
