In this exciting technique driven workshop you will create your own original stamps using compressed sponge and then print them onto fabric which will then have additional fabric paint added. Then you can guilt your pieces into cushions or small wall hangings. A great surface design technique experience!

Lisa started with traditional quilt techniques over 25 years ago, but she says "I quickly developed the urge to break the rules". She has a fascination with dyeing and surface design and now concentrates on more "serendipitous and experimental pieces". "I have a passion for sharing my knowledge and teaching", she says. In 2010 she was awarded the Jewel Pearce Patterson Scholarship for Teachers by the International Quilt Association in Houston. In 2013 C&T Published her first book *Beautiful Building Block Quilts* and in 2014 and 2015 self-published two subsequent



eBooks. Lisa is currently the president of Studio Art Quilt Associates - <u>SAQA.com</u> - and international non-profit organization dedicated to promoting the art quilt and the artists who create them.

Her other obsessions for food and travel have opened other doors and now she travels all over the world teaching and leading textile and food tours. Her hand dyed and painted fabrics are available for sale online store Dyed and Gone to Heaven accessed from her website. Lisa Lives in Sydney, Australia with her husband, Peter.

Supply List

Bring with you

- Apron or clothes suitable for getting messy
- 1.5" 2" cheap foam brush
- At least 4" foam paint roller and tray as long as it matches the size of the roller
- Plastic ice cube tray to use for paints
- Jar for water (brush cleaning)
- Small sharp scissors or craft knife and small cutting mat (12")
- Sharpie or black felt tip pen
- 12-24" ruler and pencil
- Sewing machine in working order with standard sewing foot and free motion quilting foot, bobbins, manual and extension cord.
- Selection of threads for guilting in preferred colorway
- Batting 60" x 24"

Material fee of \$20 (due to Lisa on the day of the workshop) includes the following

- 1 meter good quality white cotton fabric
- Compressed Sponge for stamps
- Use of Fabric Paints range of opaque fabric paint for stamping and transparent fabric paints for colourwash.


Laura Fraga workshop

Calls for entry

Continuing our notifications for ways to display your quilts and textile pieces to a wider audience... Entering shows is not difficult, but to begin here are a few guidelines:

- Always make sure you read everything in the call including the calendar, requirements, rules, etc. Especially the rules! Will save headaches and disappointment later on.
- Keep a record on your entries so you won't be caught with a quilt needing to go two places at once. Having to
 remove a quilt from a show or exhibit because you misread the exhibition dates is a no-no. Ask me how I know...
- Having a great photo of your quilt straight on, in focus, not on a bed or held up showing hands and feet, super important. There is lots of great info on quilt photography on line. Google!
- Don't be intimidated or depressed by a rejection! There are lots of different reasons why a quilt doesn't fit into a specific show. It is usually not because your quilt is bad!

Start with a favorite picture. Many of gals immortalizing pets in fabric, beautiful birds, and even a picture of a young moose sniffing a poppy (gal from Alaska of course). Ann showed how she would tackle everyone's picture to start the project. The class was great, so much creativity in the room! Two of us chose people for our subject, a little more challenging!

Westside Quilters General Meeting Minutes

February 3, 2018

<u>President:</u> Kim Ryan opened Westside Quilters (WQ) Winter quarterly meeting on February 3, 2018 by welcoming guests and new members.

The minutes of the October 21, 2017 quarterly meeting were circulated to WQ Board members via e-mail, and to the membership in WQ's Newsletter. Sally Wright moved to accept the minutes and Sandra Abramowitz seconded the motion. The membership accepted the minutes on a voice vote.

The Treasurer's report showed WQ's January 30th balance as \$8,353.40. The report was published in WQ's newsletter. Sally Wright moved to accept the Report and Sandy Abramowitz seconded the motion, which was then approved by the Guild.

Membership: WQ's membership has grown to over 80 quilters.

<u>Philanthropy</u>: Quilts, receiving blankets and hats were delivered to A Child's Dream and Upward Bound. Perla noted that receiving blankets should be at least 30" x 30". Also, members were encouraged to continue constructing the large paper pieced squares which will then be sewn into donation quilts. Philanthropy is still collecting quilts for Dollies Making a Difference. And, any batting that you can donate is always welcome.

<u>Programs</u>: According to Sally, Susan Brubaker Knapp's thread painting workshop on Friday was a happy and productive day for each member who attended. Today is the first day of sign-ups for Laura Fraga's Dear Jane workshop in March. Future programs include Slow Stitch Saturday on April 21st, an opportunity for members to gather and work on any hand sewing, knitting, crocheting, beading or other hand work. Just bring your project and your lunch, but leave your sewing machine home. Dessert and drinks will be provided. At the May quarterly meeting, our guest speaker will be Lisa Walton, new president of SAQA. Her workshop, "Stamp, Paint, Stitch", a surface design workshop on May 11th and her lecture on May 12th, "Textile Traveler", will be the spark new quilting interests for many WQ members.

<u>Showcase Speaker</u>: Julie Marquez provided an energetic introduction to Sewing Arts Center under her banner. Sewing Arts carries fabric from many countries including Japan and Australia. Her recommendation is: "When you see it, buy it." The only fabrics Julie replaces are Bella solids. Sewing Arts offers classes for kids as well as non-kids and on Super Bowl Sunday there will be a special discount and the Yarnover truck will be in the parking lot! See more at www.SewingArts.com.

Show and Tell: Show and Tell opened with thread painting workshop students showing off their projects. They were followed by: Sally Wright's Three Fruits; Luann Jaffe's Jewels Quilt using blue, yellow and red; Bobbi Leung's Clam Shell, Bargello Quilt and a One Block Wonder quilt for Quilts From The Heart; Virginia Marshall's Windows in the Cabin, and Purple! from a Grace E. workshop; Barbara Marom-Pollack's Leftovers in multiple solids, and portraits Yummy Girl and My Mother Wore a Purple Dress; Pat Karasick's Sunflower Rescue in 30's fabrics; Maureen Gardner's Snail, from a Sandy Corbin workshop, Formal Garden and Radiant in gold and black; Sherry Kleinman's Family Tree using aqua for family members; Bobbie Blake's Wallhanging--Table Runner using quilt scrap strips; Robert Walley's Flags using technique's from Tina Curran.

<u>Featured Speaker</u>: Susan Brubaker Knapp's talk, <u>The Artist in You</u>, awakened everyone's quilting creativity. She encouraged us to "embrace failure" because it makes you move forward, to try new techniques, to "be a lifelong learner" by taking classes, reading, studying and experimenting. She also said "never say never to a tool or technique," even older techniques. Look backward and forward for a way to solve a problem. Needless to say, we were entranced by the effects Susan creates with her thread stitching and noted with interest that it's done by stitching through the quilt top and interfacing only.
