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## Featured WQ Member:

### Susanne Cole Member since 2018

#### When did you start quilting?

I made my first quilt in 1975 after coming to United States. It was queen size made from 4" squares. I used fluffy polyester batting and tied at the corners of each square. My husband helped me pick the fabric and we came up with a design. I then made a few baby quilts. I still knew nothing about quilting. I would mark the fabric with a template and cut with scissors.

#### Why?

Growing up in Denmark I was exposed to and learned many crafts and was knitting and crocheting at age 5. My grandmothers did beautiful embroidery and my mother was a seamstress. I was always interested in learning and glad that they all were willing to teach me.

So, I was eager to take on a new craft and make a quilt. It wasn't

until the 1990s, when my husband bought me a sewing machine, I got hooked on quilting. I started taking classes and watched Alex Anderson and Quilt in a Day.

#### What types do you make?

I started with traditional quilts and was always interested in learning new techniques. I love to design my own pattern. Writing instructions is hard. You can't just assume people will know what to do. You have to be very specific for it to be a good pattern.

My all-time favorite class was with Sharon Schamber learning free-motion quilting on a Juki. I eventually started renting a longarm. That is by far my favorite part of quilting now. I am grateful for my job at Sewing Arts Center where I do longarm for customers.

#### How often do you quilt?

I pretty much quilt every day. Since I am working at Sewing Arts Center some days we are all there working on different quilting projects.

#### What time of day?

I wake up early and go to my sewing room and sew a little before going to work.

#### Why did you join Westside Quilters?

I joined the Westside Quilters to meet and talk to other quilters. Share ideas.

#### Who are your favorite teachers and lecturers?

My favorite teacher is Sharon Schamber. I love her Piecelique Technique. It is a unique way of doing curved piecing and applique.

What are your favorite workshops or conventions in the past?

I have taken a couple classes at QuiltCon with Tia Curtis and Jodi Robinson. Very cool classes.

We're looking forward to a live Road to California in January. **Congratulations to both Sherry Kleinman and Sally Wright whose quilts have been juried into the show! if there is anyone else, please let us know.** However, before sending off your entry to any show, double check to make sure that the event is actually taking place. There are a few deadlines coming up soon and some listed below to get ready for next Spring. Hopefully as 2022 progresses there will be more opportunities. Watch this space!

Here are some suggestions for quilt entry photography from International Quilt Festival. <u>PHOTOGRAPHING YOUR QUILT FOR SUBMISSION</u>

Continuing our notifications for ways to display your quilts and textile pieces to a wider audience... Entering shows is not difficult, but to begin here are a few guidelines:

- Always make sure you read everything in the call including the calendar, requirements, rules, etc. Especially the rules! Will save headaches and disappointment later on.
- Keep a record on your entries so you won't be caught with a quilt needing to go two places at once. Having to remove a quilt from a show or exhibit because you misread the exhibition dates is a no-no. Ask me how I know...
- Having a great photo of your quilt straight on, in focus, not on a bed or held up showing hands and feet, super important. There is lots of great info on quilt photography on line. Google!
- Don't be intimidated or depressed by a rejection! There are lots of different reasons why a quilt doesn't fit into a specific show. It is usually not because your quilt is bad!
