Paint-Stitch-Collage-Magic

Libby Williamson uses layers of hand painted and dyed fabrics, applique'd layers of free motion stitched components and embedded found objects in her colorful and playful designs.

Libby will be bringing already painted paper and fabric so we won't have to wait for the paint to dry, literally. She will be bringing lots of supplies with her, so we don't have to. There will be a class fee between \$10:00 - \$15:00.

Supply List

You will need your BSS (basic sewing supplies), machine in good order and a free motion foot. Libby likes to use black thread for drama and contrast, so make sure to bring black thread.

TQS viewers (The Quilt Show) on the Internet you will be able to see Libby demonstrate her painted teabag collage. Not the project that we are doing, but another idea for you to try. It is also available for free on her Facebook page for a week.

Libby just returned from teaching at Houston and will also be teaching at Craft Napa.

About Libby:

Growing up with creative, artsy parents, Libby's childhood was a world of fabric scraps and yarn, pins and needles, paint, Elmer's Glue, and a whole lot of Scotch Tape. Needlework projects were always in the works. School-day afternoons were spent fashioning doll clothes from remnants, embroidering on anything that could hold a stitch, and learning the art of patchwork quilting. As an art major in college, she focused on the classic techniques of printmaking but still found time for knitting and stitching projects. Her printmaking background led her to a passion in surface design on fabric which her current work reflects.



Though she has constructed many a quilt with traditional quilting techniques, her current passion is in the making of art quilts using layers of painted and dyed fabrics, appliquéd layers of free-motion stitched components and embedded found objects. She is a proud hoarder of all things "fiber" and thrives in a world of stitch and sew.

Libby teaches art, crafts, art quilting and sewing to students of all ages in her studio in Old Town Orange, CA and at destination retreats. In her world, not much can trump paint caked beneath her fingernails, glue in her hair, and a bowl of ice cream.

Shimmering Triangles

Jenny Bowker joins us for a special 2 day workshop sharing her "Shimmering Triangles" quilt, **March 8 & 9.** This 2 day class is a little unusual; the first day of the class starts Friday, March 8th from 9:30 to 3:30. And, the second day of class continues after the WQ Quarterly Meeting at St. John's 1:00 to 5:30 P.M.

Learn to make this colorful quilt with unique optical illusion flair. In this class you learn a quick and easy way to make half square triangles. Then you select one of several blocks that shimmer and make a lot of them. Then – you audition layouts. There are so many ways these beautiful blocks can be used and all give a lovely flicker of light like water flowing over pebbles. It is basically a scrap quilt class - but 'scraps' need to be about a square foot in area

About Jenny

Jenny Bowker has been working in Textiles since 1997 - from the time she finished a Bachelor of Arts Degree (Visual) and decided to make just one quilt.

Her background - life before quilts - was in science. She says, "I am moving towards a melding of my fine art work and my textile work. I am interested in the way pattern comes into many parts of our lives and often include some geometrical piecing in my work as I think it keeps me technically on my toes and provides a key for traditional quilters to link to my work."

She has four children and a very supportive husband who worked as a diplomat for the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. While following him she lived a total of fifteen years in Arab and Islamic countries. This might seem irrelevant to quilting, but has influenced her subject matter and much of her work reflects her love of the Middle East. She has lived in Syria, Western Samoa, Malaysia, Jordan, Jerusalem and Egypt.

"I teach and really enjoy it. There is no greater delight than to offer tools to a quilter who wants to make original work but doesn't know how to access her own ideas." For more details about her background and experience in quilting, see her website.

Calls for Entry

Continuing our notifications for ways to display your quilts and textile pieces to a wider audience... Entering shows is not difficult, but to begin here are a few guidelines:

- Always make sure you read everything in the call including the calendar, requirements, rules, etc. Especially the rules! Will save headaches and disappointment later on.
- Keep a record on your entries so you won't be caught with a quilt needing to go two places at once. Having to remove a quilt from a show or exhibit because you misread the exhibition dates is a no-no. Ask me how I know...
- Having a great photo of your quilt straight on, in focus, not on a bed or held up showing hands and feet, super important. There is lots of great info on quilt photography on line. Google!
- Don't be intimidated or depressed by a rejection! There are lots of different reasons why a quilt doesn't fit into a specific show. It is usually not because your quilt is bad!

If you are in the Bay area, you might want to drop in Livermore, taste some wine and shop for fabric at: <u>In Between the Stitches</u>, 2190 First Street, Livermore, CA 94550 Telephone number: 925-371-7064. Very easy to navigate website.

The store carries new, batik, civil war reproductions, holiday, novelty and sale fabrics. Prices range from 7.00 - 12.99. It is located in the historic part of Livermore and is very walkable with lots of restaurants nearby. There is a Farmer's Market on Sunday 9:00 - 2:00 P.M. Quilters do need more than just fabric.

Lucky me, I have relatives that live in Albany, CA just over the border of

Berkeley. Stonemountain & Daughter Fabrics is a good stop. Free angled parking out in front of the store at: 2518 Shattuck Ave. Berkeley, CA 94704. Telephone number 510-845-6106. They don't do classes anymore, so they have expanded the fabric line to include fashion fabric.
