

Internationally known art quilter and lecturer <u>Esterita Austin</u> joins us for a Friday Workshop "Sheer Faces". In this out-of-the-box class you will learn Esterita's new technique for assembling fused sheers. No templates, no points or seams to match, just free cutting to create a dynamic and expressive portrait. Sheer fabrics are the building blocks for a translucent shimmering portrait that will glow and sparkle while adding depth to your fiber art piece. See the possibilities when new shapes and colors are created by simply overlapping transparent fabrics. Add more creative tools to your fiber art repertoire.

At our Saturday quarterly meeting <u>Esterita Austin</u> will be our main speaker on "Classic Rock", a humorous look at her journey from her beginning art experiences to the present. This power point/trunk show zips along as it illustrates how she grew the seed of a concept into bold design themes. The focus is on the power of value over color in constructing dramatic compositions. With her generously dispensed tips you'll be inspired to run back to your stash and fuse your own thread of an idea into a WOW composition.

Biography

Quilt maker, designer and teacher, Esterita Austin created "The Well," a prize-winning piece in the American Museum of Folk Art's international competition "Quilted Constructions: The Spirit of Design." Her pieces have been published in the periodicals Quilting Arts, The Quilters Companion, American Quilter, Quilter's Newsletter, American Style and Distinction Magazine and Folk Art, as well as the books Contemporary Art Quilts and Fiber Arts 7. As an entrepreneur, Esterita has been featured on The Sally Jesse Raphael Show and in the "Threads" section of Newsday. Her work has appeared on the covers of the Indiana Gazette leisure section and the Arts and Lifestyles section of the Times Beacon and Times Record newspapers of Long Island, NY. You can see Esterita give a demonstration of her techniques on HGTV's Simply Quilts with Alex Anderson, segment 1134. The Quilt Show with Ricky Tims and Alex Anderson, and Quilting Arts TV.







Calls for Entry

Continuing our notifications for ways to display your quilts and textile pieces to a wider audience... Entering shows is not difficult, but to begin here are a few guidelines:

- Always make sure you read everything in the call including the calendar, requirements, rules, etc.
 Especially the rules! Will save headaches and disappointment later on.
- Keep a record on your entries so you won't be caught with a quilt needing to go two places at once.
 Having to remove a quilt from a show or exhibit because you misread the exhibition dates is a no-no.
 Ask me how I know...
- Having a great photo of your quilt straight on, in focus, not on a bed or held up showing hands and feet, super important. There is lots of great info on quilt photography on line. Google!
- Don't be intimidated or depressed by a rejection! There are lots of different reasons why a quilt doesn't fit into a specific show. It is usually not because your quilt is bad!

Editor's Note:

Okay, now that I have you looking for Waldo in his patriotic red, white and blue outfit, I want to challenge you to look for and report misuse of dockless scooter and bike that are left blocking sidewalks and doorways in your neighborhoods. YOU can help the City develop laws to regulate usage and weed out the companies not following existing rules by reporting illegally parking scooters.

I live close to Westwood Village and the Village is overrun with these dockless scooters and bikes making it unsafe for pedestrians.

The City of LA has an ordinance in effect regulating dockless scooters and bikes (e.g., Bird, Lime, Jump, Wheeles, etc.). Among other provisions, the city restricts where dockless scooters and bikes can be parked. LADOT's complete FAQs are at: https://ladot.lacity.org/what-we-do/dockless-mobility. Below is the excerpt regarding prohibited parking places:

Don't park:

• In front of driveways, crosswalks, and transit stops

- Near ADA access ramps
- Near utilities (such as fire hydrants)
- Along color curbs (such as Accessible Parking Zones-blue and Loading Zones-yellow)
- On landscaped areas or grass
- On sidewalks less than 3 feet wide
- Leave at least 6 feet of sidewalk space for pedestrians and persons with disabilities

Download the free **MyLA311 app** from your usual App store, to request via your smartphone enforcement of the dockless scooter law -- along with other service requests such as bulky item pickup, dead animal pickup, graffiti removal, illegal dumping, street lights out etc.

To make a report on the **MyLA311 app** go to "Create A Service Request", then find "Transportation" – "Dockless Mobility Enforcement". Follow the prompts: Location, Details, Comments and Add a Photo and fill in the details.

You can help regulate the proliferation of dockless scooter and bike by reporting parking noncompliance. The City is collecting data during a yearlong dockless scooter and bike pilot program, your reporting will make a difference.



Westside Quilters - AMENDED MINUTES of May 18, 2019 Quarterly Meeting

<u>President:</u> Roberta Wally opened Westside Quilters (WQ) May 18th quarterly meeting by welcoming many guests and several new members.

There were many items of business on the agenda. 1- Roberta asked for a motion to accept the minutes of WQ's March 9, 2019 quarterly meeting, as printed in WQ's Newsletter. Stephania Bommarito made the motion, Jennie Kraft seconded it, and the motion was approved on a voice vote. The minutes of the February 29, 2019 Board Meeting were also accepted and approved on a voice vote. 2 - Sally Wright moved to accept next year's Budget. Bobbie Blake seconded the motion which members approved. 3 - It was necessary to amend WQ's By Laws for 2019 - 2020 to allow Treasurer Karynn Dittmar, Membership Chair Luann Jaffe, Newsletter Chair Debbie Nussbaum, and Website Manager Sally Wright to serve a third year in these positions. Veronica Grey made the motion to amend WQ's By-Laws, and Perla Rothenberg seconded it. The motion passed.

4 - Three members were elected to two year terms on WQ's Executive Board: Barbara Marom-Pollack as Vice President, Terrie Dorio as Secretary and Nancy Kawahara as a member of the Philanthropy Committee. Sally Wright moved to accept these nominations, Sandy Ray seconded the motion and WQ's members approved these new Board members. 5 - A new Board of Directors consisting of Fred Zerez, Susan Rossi and Barbara Peters was confirmed by voice vote following Sally Wright's motion, and Luann Jaffe's second.

Since this was the last meeting of WQ's 2018-2019 year, Roberta thanked each active Board member and gave them a rose in recognition of their work on the Board. Roberta also thanked Kim Ryan, Marianne Simpson, Sonja Daniel, Sally Wright and Debbie Nussbaum for their extra efforts to benefit WQ.

Miscellaneous Presentations: Stephania Bommarito alerted members to SCCQGs challenge honoring Road to California's 25th Anniversary in 2020. She reviewed the qualifications for the challenge which are available on SCCQG's website.

A representative of the Southern California chapter of the Surface Design Association shared an invitation to attend their meeting on the morning of June 1st, where someone will talk about creating your own printed fabric with spoonflower.com. There is also a workshop available to attend that afternoon and the following day.

Membership: Luann reminded members that May is membership renewal time. She encouraged members to mail in their completed membership forms and checks in the fully addressed envelopes available at the Membership table. The Senior Center does not allow sales of any kind at the Center.

Philanthropy: Perla thanked everyone for their donations to WQ's Philanthropy projects. She requested that anyone with suggestions for next year's charities give that information to Lisa or Virginia, and that everyone support next year's Philanthropy Committee.

Newsletter: Roberta commented on the excellence of the guild's newsletter, and members agreed.

Website: Sally noted that all programs through May 2020 are available on the website, as is workshop registration information and membership applications.

<u>Programs</u>: Pat outlined future programs: next month, June 7th, WQ will host a Featherweight Clinic/Workshop presented by Lloyd Askew. Cost is \$60. WQ's July 13th workshop is a "Sew In" — an opportunity for members to just come and sew, by hand or machine, whatever they want to work on. Pat reminded members to check the location of workshops and meetings because locations vary. Following these announcements, winning ticket numbers were drawn for a give-away of several items. Winners were: Karen Roberto a fabric bundle, Karynn Dittmar - a pincushion/scraps bag, Stephanie Bommarito - a seam ripper, Linda Stone - two Bear Valley quilt show tickets, and Marianne Simpson - a seam ripper.

Show and Tell Quilts: Members showed the following quilts: Sally Wright - Shimmering Triangles from Jenny Bowker's workshop; Rachel Prentiss - a Sunflower with Labrador puppy baby quilt; Marianne Simpson - a 12 inch block of tiny stars, Quilt for Trailer depicting a trailer in a forest of trees (flannel backed for snuggling comfort), and a red and white quilt of snowball type blocks; Luann Jaffe - Tie the Knot quilt made of Australian fabrics with a black background; Pat Karasick - Honeybunnies Garden, embroidered rabbits, and Gifts from the Sea - appliquéd sea shells and other ocean symbols; Allison Leong - a scrap lattice quilt, and a quilt of bright squares made with many, many scrap triangles; Veronica Gray - scrap Patchwork bag; Virginia Marshall - Shimmering Triangles made in Jenny Bowker's workshop, Spin Some More pinwheel baby quilt, smaller pinwheel quilt; Kathryn Pellman - Multiple fashionista word salad/poem squares; Debbie Nussbaum - Crop Circles made from vegetable fabrics, stitched with vitamin information, inspired by Cathy Huber's class; Roberta Walley - a not very successful echeveria painted quilt from Susan Brubaker Knapp's class, and a more successful hibiscus made later. Vickie Bohnhoff announced that her Blue Hearts, quilted by Matt Randall, has been juried into Houston's Sapphire exhibit and will be traveling with the Celebration 2020 quilts.

<u>Featured Speaker</u>: Linda Anderson presented her outstanding fine art/stitched painting quilts to extremely attentive and interested WQ members. She recalled drawing and painting as a child, and learned to sew when she was in grade school. Linda's education includes degrees from Otis Art Institute, and a masters in counseling from Azusa Pacific. After an 18 month sailing adventure and 10 years on the island of Tobago, she and her family returned to San Diego where she discovered art quilting, the perfect mix of drawing, painting and sewing, her strongest interests. She perfected her own style of art quilting which begins with taking photographs of people, often from other cultures, involved in daily life. Once she chooses a photo and simplifies it to strengthen its message, Linda begins making the section which appears furthest away and continues to finish with the portions which are in the foreground. She creates and stitches each section as she adds it to her work, using raw edge appliqué and quilting stitches that enhance that particular section of the work. Linda uses paintable cotton fabric, white with some pattern, which she lightly washes with Jacquard Textile Paints to re-create the colors in the original photo. When Linda is constructing her work, she adds an additional layer of bamboo batting to the subjects which are nearest the viewer. The additional batting helps to enhance perspective in her works. Through her stitched paintings, Linda is able to integrate her interests and skills to create quilts with great impact.
