Barbara Danzi is an artist who makes art quilts to be hung on the wall like paintings. She incorporates bold shapes and lines with a hand drawn look.

Artist statement

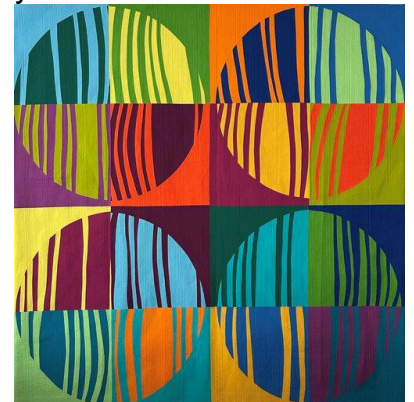
I am an artist making large scale abstract quilted textile art.

I begin each piece using expressive lines and shapes from fabric and stitch seam lines that look hand drawn and painterly. I approach my work improvisationally cutting textiles into shapes and “drawing” the lines that become stitched seams. There is a sense of the “hand of the maker” in my work. Art, craft, science, technology merge in my work. I focus on blurring the line between quilting and fine art.

The color in my work is inspired by my outdoor adventures and urban life. From backpacking in the lush green forest in Maine to kayaking in California’s Channel Island caves, SoCal beaches and NY’s Hudson River. I also bring in shapes from city buildings, bridges, train tracks, gates and archways.

I create the composition by arranging the pieces on a 14’x8’ design wall. Sometimes I rearrange the elements many times to achieve the best figure/ground tension. I then sew the pieces together leveraging an engineering process to achieve a flat quilt while preserving the hand cut lines and curves.

My professional and educational background in engineering, technology, and cybersecurity trained my brain to be curious, absorb information through diffuse awareness, and assimilate disparate facts and images into a cohesive vision. My goal is to make beautiful art following good design principles, and I often incorporate a deeper meaning from social justice or environmental concerns.

Leadership.....

Have you ever been on a Quilt Run?

It's great if you like adventure, fabric and making new friends. By definition, a quilt run is an organized map of quilt shops. The last one I took was the California Central Coast Quilt Shop Tour.

There were 10 quilt shops on the run. The theme was Hats Off! So, if you wore a hat, you got a free hat pin. There were small gifts, too. Every quilt shop had different kinds of fabric. There is not an obligation to buy fabric, but what the heck... you are in the shop might as well. My chauffeur (Husband) and I started in Ventura at **Superbuzzy**, 1794 E. Main St., Ventura 93001. It was very busy with women displaying various hats. Everyone gets a Passport to collect stamps on. Turned in at the end for a final gift and entry into a raffle for the Grand Prize of a \$1,000 gift certificate good at any of the shops. Runner-up prize is \$50.00 for 20 quilters. No, I didn't get a call.



Grant House Sewing Center, 336 E. Cota Street, Santa Barbara, 93101. This is in a warehouse, free parking out front. If you like batiks, this is a stop for you.

Next, **The Creation Station** 252 E. Hwy 246 #A, Buellton, 93427. I met up with two quilters that I have been quilting with for four years, virtually. Dawn, the owner was the creator of this year's theme. There were hat contests to vote on, treats, a photo wall in the classroom. The shop is always a visual treat with a vintage stove holding patterns, wooden ironing board displaying fabric jelly rolls and lots of novelty fabric in fat quarter cuts. There are bolts of fabric, too. Check out their website for Brown Bag retreats.



Break over, drive on north to Paso Robles. There are two shops in this town, both have recently moved into new and better spaces. **Orange Dot Quilts**, 829 10th Street, #A, Paso Robles, 93446. This shop has printed canvas, kits and two rooms of fabric. A wall of notions, too.

Down around the corner is **The Quiltery**, 1413 Riverside Ave. #B, Paso Robles, 93446. A small space packed with beautiful panels and complimentary fabrics. Whew, time for a swim at our hotel. It was hot in Paso! We fit in a little wine tasting at Field Recordings in Tin City. Dinner and bed in that order.

Next day, halfway through the shops we are off to an early start. During the Run all the shops have the same hours, 10:00 A.M. – 4:00 P.M. Friday and Saturday. Sunday hours were 9:00 A.M. -6 P.M.

Quilter's Cupboard, 5275 El Camino Real, Atascadero, 93422. This is a repurposed house with each room filled with fabrics. There was even a room with just sale fabrics.

Sew Fun 8775 El Camino Real, Atascadero, 93422 This shop really did their theme up, Brewing up Fun. Lots of space for machines, fabric and notions. Many of the quilters I met there, quilt for charity, my tribe.

Cotton Ball, 2830 Main Street, Morro Bay, 93422 had lots of pre-cuts. They are known for their batik fabric printed with sea creatures and Morro Bay images. Unfortunately, this shop is closing soon. I heard this after I returned.

Old Town Quilt Shop, 165 W. Clark Ave., Orcutt ,93455, Quilt Roundup theme and best cookies. Lots of fun games to play winning quilt related items. This shop has lots of neutral fabrics and fun flannel prints. You can also sign up and get a weekly video highlighting their newest fabrics. Hosts retreats, too.

Roxanne's, 919 Maple Ave., Carpinteria, 93013, last stop, so I turned in my Passport! I was the first one to do so at their shop. The ladies were thrilled. This shop has the full line of Kaffe Fassett fabrics, plus many Tilda fabrics. It also sells refurbished Featherweight machines and yarn.



What a great get away! Save the date for next year May 29-31, 2026. Don't be sad if you missed this run. SoCal is having their own Run called Summer Fun, 25 shops are participating. Each shop will give you a free Robert Kaufman Quilter's Linen fat quarter and a free summer pattern. Dates are July 10-13 and 17-20. Thursday – Saturday hours are 9:00 A.M. -6:00 P.M. Sunday the hours are 10:00 A.M. -4:00 P.M. Don't have time for a run? Why not just go on a little jog? Visit a few shops and collect a few fat quarters and patterns.

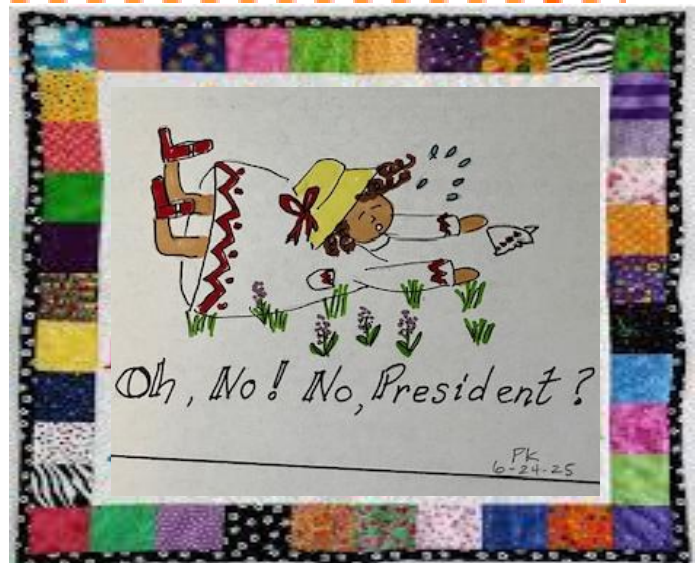

Here are some suggestions for quilt entry photography from International Quilt Festival.

PHOTOGRAPHING YOUR QUILT FOR SUBMISSION

- Having a great photo of your quilt - straight on, in focus, not on a bed or held up showing hands and feet, super important. There is lots of great info on quilt photography on line. Google!

Entering shows is not difficult, but to begin here are a few guidelines: Always make sure you read everything in the call including the calendar, requirements, rules, etc.

- Especially the rules! Will save headaches and disappointment later on.
- Keep a record on your entries so you won't be caught with a quilt needing to go two places at once.
- Having to remove a quilt from a show or exhibit because you misread the exhibition dates is a no-no. Ask me how I know...
- Don't be intimidated or depressed by a rejection! There are lots of different reasons why a quilt doesn't fit into a specific show. It is usually not because your quilt is bad!
