"Fabric Postcards" Workshop Friday August 12, 2022


10:00am - 1:00 pm.

The workshop fee is s \$30 plus a \$14 pattern fee (\$16 if it includes the heavy-duty interfacing).

"Fabric Postcards", is one of Carol Morissey's most popular workshops. These colorful little pieces are fun to create, they're quick, and they make great gifts. Plus, they're a standard size, so they can be easily and inexpensively framed! Carol has three different postcard collections from which to choose (pattern purchase is required for the workshop). And, as a bonus, if you give Carol enough advance notice, she will design a couple of original postcards just for your group!


Carol will share her favorite fusing techniques while we make colorful postcards using fused, raw edge appliqué. You can actually mail these postcards if you want, or use them as gifts, frame them, or swap with friends.

Each participant is required to purchase one of her postcard patterns (www.ocaroldesigns.com).





- 1. Pencil and note paper
- 2. Wonder Under #805, or your preferred brand of paper backed fusible web. One yard is plenty.
- 3. A non-stick pressing sheet or a piece of parchment paper
- 4. A light box, or a bright window where you can trace
- 5. Scissors
- 6. Iron and ironing surface
- 7. Peltex 72F heavy duty interfacing or similar product (it's stiff, like a hat brim). Postcards measure 4" x 6", so you may purchase the amount of Peltex based on how many you wish to make. It should measure 20" wide on the bolt, which means that if you cut carefully, you can cut 15 pieces from half a yard. Some brands or types of heavy-duty interfacing such as this have fusible web on one side, both sides, or none at all. It doesn't matter which type you get because you can add Wonder Under to your background fabric or to the interfacing. I like the 72F because it has fusible on both sides.
- 8. Rotary cutter, ruler, and mat
- 9. Optional but useful: tweezers



Fabric:

Each postcard requires two 4" x 6" pieces of fabric, one for the front and one for the back.

These can be the same, or two different fabrics. The pieces for the appliqué shapes are small, so gather your colorful scraps. Batiks are recommended because of their tight weave.


Sewing machine: A machine is not required for this class. However, you may choose to do some free-motion stitching on the appliqué later. I also zigzag or satin stitch around the outer edges of the cards when they're finished.


Carol Morrissey

At our Quarterly Meeting quilt judge and certified quilt appraiser **Lisa Erlandson** presents "Make Your Best Quilt." What does a judge see when they look at a quilt? How does an appraiser determine the value of your quilt?

This lecture examines the features a judge may look for in choosing a winning quilt as well as the qualities of a quilt that may increase or decrease the appraised value. More importantly, we will talk the simple things you can do to improve your skills. Even if you never intend to enter your quilt into a competitive contest or have it appraised, you want to make the best quilt you are capable of! Tips will be given to help you make the best quilt you can, whether the quilt is heading to a contest or to cover a loved one.

Bio

Lisa Erlandson is a compulsive quilt collector whose habit has led to several quilt-related specialties. She is an AQS Certified Appraiser of Quilted Textiles, lecturer, quilt show judge, teacher and quilt historian. And, she is a past president of the American Quilt Study Group. Lisa has appeared on 'The Quilt Show with Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims'.

She learned to sew as a child but considered it punishment (and maybe it was). She re-discovered sewing in the mid 1980s as a drama teacher and made her first quilt in 1991. Lisa has a Master of Arts degree in Public Communication from the University of North Texas. She taught junior high school, high school and college before deciding to focus on the quilt world.

We still have a few pieces of batting and lots of fabric for backs available, so please contact us at philanthropy@westsidequilterslosangeles.org. We appreciate you!



Calls for Entry June 2022

So happy to say the quilt shows and exhibits are slowly coming back to life even as the pandemic continues. A few special exhibit calls for Quit Festival Houston are open now and closing soon. Please see the listing below. Nothing for AQS right now - their shows start up again in February with calls for entry starting this Fall. Right now, as always, before sending off your entry to any show, double check to make sure that the event is actually taking place. See below. Hopefully as 2022 progresses there will be more opportunities. Watch this space!

Here are some suggestions for quilt entry photography from International Quilt Festival.

PHOTOGRAPHING YOUR QUILT FOR SUBMISSION

Continuing our notifications for ways to display your quilts and textile pieces to a wider audience... Entering shows is not difficult, but to begin here are a few guidelines:

- Always make sure you read everything in the call including the calendar, requirements, rules, etc. Especially the rules! Will save headaches and disappointment later on.
- Keep a record on your entries so you won't be caught with a quilt needing to go two places at once. Having to remove a quilt from a show or exhibit because you misread the exhibition dates is a no-no. Ask me how I know...
- Having a great photo of your quilt straight on, in focus, not on a bed or held up showing hands and feet, super important. There is lots of great info on quilt photography on line. Google!
- Don't be intimidated or depressed by a rejection! There are lots of different reasons why a quilt doesn't fit into a specific show. It is usually not because your quilt is bad!

CELEBRATION OF LIFE Quilting can be a showing of love and honor by an artist. For this exhibit, depict how you, a family member, or a friend has celebrated a loved one's wedding, birth, birthday, or memorial. Remember to include your inspiration in the artist's statement, which will tell why the work was created and who it is for. The piece may be a traditional, art, or modern quilt.

Tactile Architecture Buildings have a long history of inspiring the creative designs of quiltmakers. In the 19th century, American quilters developed classic architectural patterns such as Log Cabin, Schoolhouse, and Brick Wall. 

Great workshop with David Owen Hastings





Or course, quilters might not need the iron to be hot as long as other types of users. I would like to hear any advice WQ members have about cordless irons, including brands and/or models they like or don't like." PINWHEELS OF PROMISE

SHARING MESSAGES OF HOPE, LOVE, AND HEALING THROUGH QUILTS

YOU WILL NEED:

(4) 5* squares (2 of 2 different fabrics)

(4) 4" white squares

(1) 8 1/2" square batting

(1) 8 1/2" square backing

(1) small button

10" ribbon


*If adding binding, you will need (1) 2 1/4" x 44" strip of fabric

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS:

- Fold each of the white squares in half on a diagonal, and half again, creating a triangle.
- Take each folded triangle line up the raw edges alongside the bottom, left-hand side of each of the squares as shown in diagram. Use a %" seam allowance to sew the triangles on.



 Arrange squares to sew into a 4-patch square, using a ¼" seam allowance. Press seams open.



4. Trim pinwheel blocks to measure 8°. Place on top of an 8 ½° backing and batting piece. Quilt through all layers, leaving the dimensional pinwheels alone. Do not stitch through the triangles. Once quilted, trim backing and batting to measure the same as the front.



**if you are not adding binding, simply quilt through the top and batting ONLY. Trim batting to be even with the top once it is quilted. Place 8" backing piece right side down on top of the front piece.

Sew ¼" seam allowance all the way around the outside, leaving a small 3" opening on one side to turn right side out. Clip corners to reduce bulk and turn right-side out. Fold in the opening and top-stitch 1/8" around the entire outside.

- If you are adding binding, this is the time to do so using your preferred binding method.
- Attach a 10" piece of ribbon, folded in half, in the top corner of the mini quilt and hand-stitch to the back for hanging. Sew a small button in the center of the pinwheel.

Featured Speaker: David Owen Hastings - "Exploring Nature with Paper & Stitch"

David Owen Hastings is a graphic designer living on the Olympic Peninsula in Washington state. He works with non-profits and is also a gallery artist designing with stitched paper. He has been seriously quilting for the last 8 years. Creativity has always been in his life since he started knitting and embroidery when he was young.

David's paper-based work starts with paper he designs and prints himself with a monotype procedure, then cuts apart, collages the pieces, and sews it together. His designs have a modern feeling and he loves using transparency.

Inspirations include nature, man-made structures, textures in nature that have been created by insects, time or weather, and different cultures. Japan and the arts of Shibori and Sashiko are a big influence on him. David recommends "collecting with your camera" things that may inspire you and changing photos to black & white to really see them. Curating a collection of your photos in Instagram or Pinterest is also a good idea. Using idea boards for inspiration works too.

David emphasized that quilters are designers so make your project your own - how you want it to be. Quilters are also colorists, engineers, historians, social commentators, a caring community and Artists.

The talk was illustrated with many inspiring photos of David's quilts and paper work.
