Getting those UFOs done!!!

Are you like me and have a pile of UFO's?

Well, since the start of the pandemic I was completing puzzles thinking like many, this would only last a few months. When it became apparent that this pandemic was lasting much longer than I anticipated the 20+ puzzles I finished became boring and tiresome, so...I decided to dig into my UFO's.

What a can of worms I opened up! The only problem was...where and how was I going to start?

My "Big Idea"?...was to completely empty my sewing room, sort everything by:

- 1. KEEP
- 2. TOSS
- 3. DONATE

and get organized.

I didn't realize I had so many unfinished projects, and I wondered how I would prioritize this task. I went online to see how other quilters were considering the best way to tackle this feat. Then there's "Just get it done", also on YOUTUBE. I think you will find this informative whether you are entering a quilt in a show, or just want to share one with your family or friends.


About Trudy





Calls for Entry May 2021

As we have learned recently most shows and exhibits this Fall and Winter have either been cancelled, postponed or have gone virtual. All AQS quilt competitions at their shows for 2021 are cancelled. International Quilt Festival is planning an in person show in Fall 2021 and their calls are below. However, before sending off your entry to any show, double check to make sure that the event is actually taking place. There are a few deadlines coming up soon and some listed below to get ready for next Spring and Fall. Hopefully as 2021 progresses there will be more opportunities. Watch this space!

Here are some suggestions for quilt entry photography from International Quilt Festival. <u>PHOTOGRAPHING YOUR QUILT FOR SUBMISSION</u>

Continuing our notifications for ways to display your quilts and textile pieces to a wider audience... Entering shows is not difficult, but to begin here are a few guidelines:

- Always make sure you read everything in the call including the calendar, requirements, rules, etc. Especially the rules! Will save headaches and disappointment later on.
- Keep a record on your entries so you won't be caught with a quilt needing to go two places at once. Having to remove a quilt from a show or exhibit because you misread the exhibition dates is a no-no. Ask me how I know...
- Having a great photo of your quilt straight on, in focus, not on a bed or held up showing hands and feet, super important. There is lots of great info on quilt photography on line. Google!
- Don't be intimidated or depressed by a rejection! There are lots of different reasons why a quilt doesn't fit into a specific show. It is usually not because your quilt is bad!

The calls below are just a sample of the many opportunities out there. For more search "Fiber Art Calls for Entry" or "Quilt Calls for Entry"

Martha Sielman the Executive Director of SAQA is working on a new book which will celebrate all types of **fiber art about birds**. It will hopefully be published in 2023. She is looking for a variety of birds, compositions, techniques, and approaches. To submit your work, fill out the submission form at https://www.saqa.com/events/call-submissions-book-about-birds. *The deadline is April 30, 2021*. Final decisions about inclusion will be in July.

Hands All Around

In Full Bloom

Just as quilters create beautiful pieces of art with fabric, florists and gardeners cultivate works of beauty from the soil. The International Quilt Festival will showcase floral quilts from across the spectrum in color and splendor in the special exhibit. This exhibit will premiere at the International Quilt Market and Festival/Houston, October 28 thru 31 – 2021. We would also like to retain quilts for a possible exhibit at International Quilt Festivals in 2022.

- Limit two (2) entries per person.
- Each work must measure a minimum of 36" on each side.
- The quilt can be NO LONGER than 96" ON A SIDE.
- There is a \$20 submission fee per quilt.
- The works must be made between 2017 and 2021.
- Entry Deadline May 21, 2021

In The American Tradition

Contemporary quiltmakers often look to the art form's rich tradition for inspiration in their own works. This exhibit features recently-made quilts that incorporate traditional blocks, styles, and/or techniques.

Sewing became an important part of my life at 8 years old! My older cousin gave me a needle, thread and some linen fabric that she purchased at the 5 and dime store.



I've been working on a quilt for some special friends. It's kind of a collaboration in the sense that I have offered them choices. They are thrilled to get a custom made quit and jumped at my offer to make them a large lap quilt.

First, I emailed pictures of about 10 quilts that they might like, testing out options of traditional to modern quilts. They had asked for a gray and blue quilt to match the room where they would put the quilt. Okay, so I pulled out all my grays and some of the blues that are part of my stash and took a picture of a lineup of the grays and the blues. I also grabbed a few screen shots of gray fabrics at Sewing Arts Center, put them in an email as additional fabric options. They also got to select the fabric for the back, once again fabrics available at Sewing Arts Center.

The choices came back:

- 1) First option in list of 10 patterns. Yippee, I've wanted to make that quilt since I saw it on Pinterest.
- 2) "Just use the fabric you have in your stash."

With all the fabric decisions made, the challenge became trying to create a handsome interesting quilt from mostly grays and few blues when the Pinterest photo inspiration was an array of lively "modern" colors. The pattern itself is quite simple, cut rectangles your desired size then miter the pieces together the same way you would if connecting fabric strip to make binding!

I'm pleased to share my interpretation of the quilt that was posted on Pinterest. I'm toying with a title for Nate & Lorry's quilt "16 Shades of Gray", "Mitered in Gray", or "Quilting with Bob Ross" now that I found this Mrs. Bobbin cartoon the other day *(see cartoon below).*

What have you been working on? Looking forward to seeing everyone.
