Our officers and members put a high priority on their guild. They come to meetings, support workshops, and share their work. They enjoy the company of other guilters and sewers.




In this season of Giving we gather once again on November 10th for a day of Philanthropy.

Leadership.....

Desmond Tutu reminded us that if we do a little bit of good here and now, that when all our little bits are put together they overwhelm the world.

Jack Morrow, who was born in Fargo, ND in 1923, is certainly doing his part in that endeavor. Seven years ago, after moving to a retirement community in Minneapolis, he needed something to keep him occupied. His wife suggested he join a club that made baby blankets. He knew little or nothing about sewing but decided to give it a go. Boy, did he ever! He made a commitment that he would make 500 quilts before he was 95. Jack calls his blankets "Bundles of Love" and carries his supplies in an ad hoc tool belt sewn from spare material tied to his walker. He often worked 10 hours a day even missing meals so he could meet his goal. Once he even fell asleep at his ancient Singer machine, but he finished his epic goal with a big robot guilt. Jack acknowledges that it's not his most complicated quilt, but as he explained in blueinked cursive on a yellow sticky note stuck to the guilt, "This one looked so cute, I couldn't cut it." Now that Mr. Morrow has kept his promise to himself, he's not sure how many more quilts he is going to make—a few more he thinks. His wife says she's glad to have a bit more of his company.

And then there is Burgess Marshbank from South Carolina who claims he needed something to keep him busy as he was approaching his 90th birthday. His wife, who is an accomplished quilter, suggested he paint a quilt pattern on a large piece of wood. Burgess' mother was an artist and although he'd never tried, he thought he would give it a try. He looked through pattern books and selected ones that looked good to him and away he went. So far he has painted 165 blocks that are as precise as any ½ inch seam you've ever seen. He says that his "interest became a joy" and gives most of them as gifts to people he feels deserve recognition. The

last one went to a retired woman who tirelessly volunteers for Meals on Wheels. It's proudly displayed next to her front door. Mr. Marshbank says he wants to inspire people to do something exciting that they have never done before and dare to be daring.

Well, after such exceptional examples I know I need to up my game a whole bunch. Can't let those men beat us—they can join us certainly, but not overtake! I'm kidding, of course. Joining all our little bits can and will overwhelm the world.



Calls for Entry

For some great information from a veteran on how to get your work shown see this blog entry from Sue Bleiweiss https://suebleiweiss.blog/2018/06/14/getting-your-work-out-there/

Continuing our notifications for ways to display your quilts and textile pieces to a wider audience... Entering shows is not difficult, but to begin here are a few guidelines:

- Always make sure you read everything in the call including the calendar, requirements, rules, etc. Especially the rules! Will save headaches and disappointment later on.
- Keep a record on your entries so you won't be caught with a quilt needing to go two places at once. Having to remove a quilt from a show or exhibit because you misread the exhibition dates is a no-no. Ask me how I know...
- Having a great photo of your quilt straight on, in focus, not on a bed or held up showing hands and feet, super important. There is lots of great info on quilt photography on line. Google!
- Don't be intimidated or depressed by a rejection! There are lots of different reasons why a quilt doesn't fit into a specific show. It is usually not because your quilt is bad!

Programs: Follow Up

Jenny Impey Workshop – Class Review By Pat Karasick

What I know for sure is that Jean Impey is a whacking good teacher. Now that I am home trying to finish what I started, I really appreciate her skills. I laid out my strips, cut my background, threaded my machine and put a bobbin in. Caution: the strips rearrange themselves. How does that happen? I don't even have a cat anymore to blame it on.

Caution: Be sure to keep the triangles in the spiraling square, if they turn around you will not be able to sew them back into the matching squares. Always keep the numbered part in the middle. Always keep them the same side up.



It takes me about a half hour to cover one triangle. Caution: cut enough strips, or at least keep out the fabric that you are using. Will I have it done in time for Show and tell?


Instead of a top, maybe a couple of pillow tops. Can't wait to see what the rest of you completed.

Jean has a great video on YouTube for installing the zipper. https://sewjean.shutterfly.com/pictures/245

You have sewn together the matching triangles together, and cut them a perfect 10" square. If you need reassurance watch her other video reminding you how to trim and square your blocks https:sewjean.com/tutorials/spider-web-students/. Cut away the underneath tip of muslin to reduce the bulk.

Now, it is the exciting part iron seams open, whack the center with your Dead Head Blow Hammer, heat up center again which leaves it flat as a pancake. If you don't have a dead head hammer, you can borrow mine. A bright Tangerine orange dead head hammer is the one thing that I can always

find in my sewing room.

Westside Quilters (WQ) Executive Board met at Sally Wright's home on September 23, 2018. President Roberta Walley called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

<u>President:</u> Roberta called for a motion to approve the August 18, 2018 general meeting minutes. Sonja moved to accept the minutes, and Brenda seconded the motion. The minutes were approved by voice vote.

The Board discussed Velda Newman's two day workshop on Texture and Form. Board members who took the class felt that the techniques they learned could easily be used in other projects. Consensus was that Velda Newman was well organized and professional. Jean Impey's Spiderweb workshop, which members enjoyed, was also discussed. Jean had all the supplies she recommended, and she demonstrated their uses. Nineteen people took the workshop, only 1 short of the maximum possible.

Board members acknowledged that two-day workshops, which usually occur on the Thurs. and Friday before a quarterly meeting, are difficult for some members to attend. Jenny Bowker's 2-day workshop in March, 2019 will be on Friday and the Sat. afternoon following the quarterly meeting.

Vice-President: Sonja will be attending the SCCQG meeting on "Philanthropy and Community Outreach" on October 13th.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Karynn was unable to attend this meeting, but will be following up with St. Andrew's to make sure that WQ has paid the rent for Jenny Lyon's workshop on August 12th. WQ's present balance is \$9,466.

Membership: Luann indicated WQ's membership is unchanged. She will be checking the mail box within a day or two.

<u>Website</u>: Sally W. noted that she needs more photos from the Jean Impey workshop. The website is being updated constantly, and the new password for the Members Only page will be in place within a day.

<u>Newsletter</u>: The September deadline for newsletter submissions is September 27th, and the October deadline will be early, October 23rd. Debbie again asked for articles by WQ members. She noted Perla had written one recently.

<u>Philanthropy</u>: Lisa will verify that the room for WQ's Giving for Thanksgiving workshop at St. John's on Nov. 10th is reserved. At the workshops, stations will be set up for the various types of work that need to be done. Members are asked to bring tops, fabric, batting, receiving blanket fabrics: cotton and flannel, and sewing machines, of course. The workshop is a potluck. An announcement will be made at WQ's quarterly meeting in October, and in the November newsletter.

<u>Programs</u>: Arrangements for Jenny Lyons' workshop and lecture at WQ's Fall General Meeting are going forward. She will be staying at a member's home. Pat said she is looking for a whiteboard for Jenny, and several options were suggested. The Demonstration portion of the October meeting will be handled by Pat who will show members how to make Sharon Schambers' portable, but strong, Perfect Pressing Board. Brenda said that the Showcase portion will be presented by Victoria Jung of the Sew Together Stitching Lounge. Roberta mentioned that she had been contacted by St. Andrew's with a request that members be asked to park in the church parking lot. Neighbors have complained about extra cars parking on the street. An announcement about parking at St. Andrew's will be made at the October meeting.

<u>Future Business</u>: Quilts for victims of the Carr Fire in Northern California will be coordinated through Philanthropy and the South Bay Quilt Guild.

The next WQ Executive Board meeting will be at Sally's home on November 3rd at 10:00 a.m. There being no further business, the WQ Executive Board Meeting was adjourned at 3:15 p.m.
