Thank you quilters! At the October meeting we received 3 finished quilts for the Wounded Warrior Project and baby quilts--9 finished and 8 almost finished. At this date, we have collected 85 squares which will be combined to make baby quilts at the November workshop. There are additional quilts/tops being completed and several people who have said they will be bringing both quilts and squares to the workshop in November.



Thank you for your many donations and all the support for this project!

Briefly blocks for Wounded Warrior should be 12" x 12" and tops 48 x 78" and baby quilt blocks a 5" novelty with a 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sash to finish as a 6" block or tops at a suggested 36x48". More details in the last month's news.

WESTSIDE QUILTERS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

SEPTEMBER 26, 2015

A meeting of the Executive Board of Westside Quilters was held on September 28th, 2015 at the home of Sally Wright.

President Perla Rothenberg welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 10.10 am. Officers attending were Aileen Cooke, Karynn Dittmar, Luann Jaffe, Tina Nord, Debbie Nussbaum, Kathryn Pellman, Perla Rothenberg, Hilary Smith, Roberta Walley, Sue Woods, Sally Wright.

The motion to approve the minutes of the July 25th Executive Board meeting was made by Sally Wright, seconded by Hilary Smith, and approved by all.

President's Report: Perla Rothenberg discussed member Dawn Sliskovich' offer to host the December Holiday Tea at her Rancho Palos Verdes home. The Board recommended dates of Saturday, December 5 or 12; that the Board manage carpools; and shopping or other activities in South Bay be presented to members. Perla will contact Dawn to confirm.

Perla announced that dates for all 2016 quarterly meetings have been confirmed with St. John's Presbyterian Church. Workshop teacher Larene Smith gave Westside Quilters three of her patterns as gifts to be given away at the October quarterly meeting.

Vice President's Report: Debbie Nussbaum said that the next Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds (SCCQG) quarterly meeting will be October 3 in Simi Valley. The discussion topic will be social media.

Membership Report: Karynn Dittmar reported that membership now stands at 81.

Website: Sally Wright told of her efforts to obtain detailed information for all quilts displayed at the Show & Tell portion of quarterly meetings. This information is needed to identify quilts added to the website.

Treasurer's Report: Tina Nord reported a cash balance is \$7,480 as of October 1 (when \$350 in payments for the annual SCCQG insurance premium and dues will be sent). In October expenses for Mark Lipinski's workshop, quarterly meeting lecture, and travel expenses will be paid. The treasury will have an estimated balance of \$5,000 at December 31. The Irena Bluhm August workshop had a loss of \$452. The Larene Smith September workshop had a profit of \$155. Tina reviewed the SCCQG policy for liability insurance and the need to have contracts from all Westside Quilters venues.

Newsletter: Aileen Cooke and Luann Jaffe reiterated that the deadline for the October newsletter has passed. Aileen and Luann introduced the idea of having a forum of quilting questions in the newsletter. The Board expressed the opinion that YouTube and other Internet sources provided more information than could be printed in the newsletter.

Philanthropy: Hilary Smith and Sue Woods discussed details of the November 7 Philanthropy "Giving for Thanksgiving" workshop and the advance preparations needed. The goal is to have quilts layered and quilted to bring to the workshop for binding and other finishing. The monthly newsletter articles have explicit dimensions and ideas.

Batting donations have been solicited from members. Roberta Walley contacted Tanya Heldman, WQ member and professional longarm quilter, who sourced 80% cotton/20% poly batting, 93" x 30 yard, at a wholesale price of \$137. The Board authorized the purchase of this batting for the Philanthropy workshop and any future projects. Through the newsletter and at the October quarterly meeting, WQ members will be asked to sign up for the November workshop. Although no charge to WQ members, attendance numbers are needed. The workshop will be held at St. John's Presbyterian Church.

Hilary clarified the schedule for scholarship students at future workshops. It was agreed not to have a scholarship student for the Mark Lipinski October workshop.

Programs: Sally Wright, Roberta Walley and Kathryn Pellman discussed logistics for Mark Lipinski's visit in October for the 16th workshop and 17th quarterly meeting. A potluck dinner will be arranged for October 15 if Lipinski is agreeable. Currently only 2 or 3 spaces are unsold for the workshop. At the October 17 meeting, Roberta Walley will demonstrate a quilt block pattern and Linda Miller will be the Showcase Presenter with her prayer flag program. Registration for the Luke Haynes February workshop will open at the October quarterly meeting. As previously agreed by the Board, the November Philanthropy workshop will be free to members although members will be asked to make voluntary contributions to cover costs; the January Annual UFO Workshop will have a \$20 registration fee.

The next Executive Board meeting will be held at the home of Sally Wright on Saturday, October 31st at 10 am.

The meeting was adjourned at 12 pm.
