By the end of the second day there were 20 diverse images on fabric. We had birds, flowers, fruit, eggs, and dogs. We had beloved family photos. Lura encouraged everyone individually.

PHILANTHROPY

The Philanthropy committee is continuing preparations for the November Project Day. As you know, Cindy Simon and Dorothy Miyake from *Dollies Making A difference* were the showcase speakers at the August general meeting and shared the exciting work of their group which is the main focus of the Philanthropy project this year. Completed quilts – all sizes – may be returned at the next two workshops or any General meeting.

Members may continue to work on the "kid" quilts and the Wounded Warrior Quilts and the committee will distribute them as we did in the past. "Kid" quilts should measure approximately 36" x 48" finished and Wounded Warrior Quilts should measure 48" x 78".

Directions for the "Dollie" quilts:

Each finished quilt is approximately 16"x16" consisting of a top and back. Batting may be used but is not required if you are using flannel. The quilts can be any design and appropriate for boys (with teddy bear) or girls (with dollies).

WESTSIDE QUILTERS EXUTIVE BOARD MEETING August 6, 2016

At 10:15 a.m., Saturday, August 6, 2016, the Executive Board meeting of Westside Quilters (WQ) was called to order by President Kim Ryan.

<u>Pres. Report</u>: Kim announced that volunteers Karynn Dittmar and Madeline Ehrlich will assist Stephanie Wexler set up the August 20th WQ quarterly meeting. The Fabric Sale at the meeting will be organized by Aileen Cooke and Lisa Drew. Board members suggested that when the meeting ends, Kim remind everyone to return their chairs to the stacks at the back of the room. Kim will do that.

<u>Vice President:</u> The long-arm is available to anyone who wishes to use it, but they need to call Hilary to make arrangements. Debbie has not had a response to the letter she sent to the original owner. As for WQ's liability insurance, we are waiting for the application for renewal from the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds.

<u>Membership</u>: Karyn Dittmar noted that WQ's membership presently stands at 65. She will send a reminder e-mail to prior members before the August meeting. The new roster will be in place after that meeting and non-members will not have access to it.

<u>Philanthropy</u>: WQ received a thank you from **Imagine LA** for last year's donation. **Imagine LA** is a pilot mentoring group for children and families moving from foster or homeless programs to everyday society. Families are recommended by other assistance groups. Another group, Dollies Making a Difference, will provide the Showcase presentation at our August quarterly meeting. Scholarship recipients have been chosen for our August and October workshops.

Website: Sally Wright stated that the password for members changed August 1st, and it is working.

<u>Treasurer</u>: Patti is learning the financial software used by WQ. She asked to be notified as soon as possible when a check is required, and since she will be away in September, please request funds soon. The actual balance for WQ has not really changed since the August newsletter, which prompted Patti to request that budget reports be done quarterly and publicized in the WQ newsletter for quarterly meetings. The budget and accounting information would then be more aligned with WQ's general procedures. The Board agreed unanimously to this request. It was also noted that the Fabric Sale will not require sales tax because funds paid are a donation. No actual price is charged for the items available for purchase.

<u>Newsletter</u>: Aileen noted that WQ's Newsletter consists of whatever photos or articles are provided by Board members. Deadline for the September newsletter is August 26th.

<u>Programs</u>: Sally Wright reported that Lura Schwartz Smith's 2-day workshop is sold out. Nine or 10 WQ members are attending as well as members from local quilt guilds and art quilt groups. The Board agreed to Sally's suggestion that the non WQ members be invited to attend the August quarterly meeting as WQ's guests. Also, since income from this event would allow WQ to rent rectangular tables for the workshop, the Board approved the rental.

Roberta described the September 17th Sew In at St. Andrews as an opportunity for members to work on any project they are doing, sewing machine or not. Attendees are asked to bring a salad or desert. There will be demonstrations during the day. She suggested that one bring a phone or Ipad to photograph the demonstration samples. The Sew In will cost \$20 per person.

<u>General Meeting Business</u>: Discussion among Board members indicated that the break allows time for workshop sign ups, any business required with the treasurer, sign ups on the Show and Tell list, and an additional opportunity for members to watch the demonstration in progress, or view and shop the speaker's wares.

At WQ's August meeting the Showcase Speaker will come before the break and will discuss the charitable program titled "Dollies Making a Difference". Member Kathryn Pellman will demonstrate fabric weaving and its various applications. WQ's October meeting will feature Jan Krentz of Lone Star fame.

The next Executive Board meeting will be October 1st at Sally Wright's home.

Today's meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
