PHILANTHROPY



For the October 17, meeting we will be sharing squares, fabric and supplies in preparation for the 4th Annual Giving for Thanksgiving Philanthropy Workshop scheduled for Saturday, November 7, 2015. This year the workshop will focus on making quilts for Wounded Warriors and continue with the children's quilts for the local charity project begun last year.

Many of the WQ have already started working on:

- 1. Wounded Warrior Project: FOR SHARING/EXCHANGING: Create patriotic themed blocks (finished block size 12"x12") that can be mixed and matched with blocks from other WQ members creating sampler style quilts for the Wounded Warriors Project. Remember we have both men and women who are our Wounded Warriors. If you prefer to complete a top it can be any design blocks, strips, etc. as long as the completed quilt meets the Wounded Warriors criteria (finished 48" x 78"). The 12"x 12" blocks will be for the block share/exchange and assembled either at home or at the workshop.
- *Children's Quilts. FOR SHARING/EXCHANGING: The suggestion is to make blocks with a finished 5" center square (cut at 5 1/2") made from "kid friendly" fabric then surrounded by single 1" (cut 1 1/2" to allow for seam allowance) frame using a "smallish" print or solid color fabric. This assembled block will be 7 1/2"x7 1/2". These blocks may be shared/exchanged and mixed with other blocks to create quilt tops.

If you prefer to complete a top it can be any "kid friendly" design – blocks, strips, panels, etc. The goal is **for quilts to finish at** 36" **x** 48" **approximately.**

Please bring what you have to the October meeting to swap with other members for preassembly of the tops before the November meeting.

As you plan ahead, these will be the things we will need at the workshop:

- 1. Appropriate 100% cotton fabric for backing and finishing both the Wounded Warrior quilts and pillowcases and fabric for the children's quilts
- 2. 2 ½"binding folded and lightly pressed
- 3. Batting 100% cotton and 80/20 blends are acceptable
- 4. This year we do not have access for the quilting to be done prior to the workshop. WQ members who are comfortable bringing sewing machines to the workshop to finish sewing quilts, adding the bindings and doing the quilting will be greatly appreciated.

The workshop last year was well organized by Debbie and Tanya so we hope to continue the same arrangement. At the November Workshop, we will assemble all pre-prepared quilts (you can bring these to the WQ meetings or contact one of us to arrange for pick-up), cut and piece tops, have ironing/pressing stations, binding assembly and binding sewing stations, all working together to make our time at the Workshop as productive as possible.

Sewing Chatter

Background: A few Christmases ago, I asked for a sewing cabinet and gave directions (specific orders). Sometime before the day, the cabinet got delivered and another package. I had no idea what it was until Christmas when I opened it—a monster computerized sewing machine. My old machine was +20 years old, not computerized, but very reliable. The new one had a long learning curve and much frustration.

One thing I learned—never remove the top thread backwards across the tension discs. I think this is recommended for most sewing machines, but try it with the monster and face frustration for twenty minutes. Instead, cut the thread at the spool and pull the thread through the needle. That is a waste of nearly a yard of thread—how irritating. Now, I put them in a spot and pick up one for hand sewing so there is less waste.

The other point for our reader is to match the top thread to the bobbin thread where possible. The Pfaff (not the monster machine) sews better with matching polyester thread or cotton thread. I've used different polyester threads together and that seems OK but not e.g., polyester on top and cotton on the bottom.



WESTSIDE QUILTERS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING

July 25, 2015

A meeting of the Executive Board of Westside Quilters was held on July 25th, 2015 at the home of Sally Wright.

Vice President Debbie Nussbaum welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 10.08am. President Perla Rothenberg was unable to attend. Officers attending were Sally Wright, Tina Nord, Luann Jaffe, Karynn Ditmar, Hilary Smith, Sue Woods, Kathryn Pellman, Roberta Walley, Stephanie Wexler and Lisa Drew.

The motion to approve the minutes of the May 30thExecutive Board meeting was made by Sally Wright, seconded by Roberta Walley, and approved by all.

Vice President's Report: Debbie spoke about attending her first meeting of the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds. It was hosted by the Glendale Guild and was well attended with approximately 90 guilds represented.

Membership Report: Karynn Dittmar reported that 60 members have renewed their memberships. There are 3 new members so far this year. 29 people have not yet renewed. Current membership cards have been sent out.

Website: Sally Wright received flyers promoting the L.A. Quilt Show and Fiber Art Fest at Crafted At The Port. This is taking place on August 8th and 9th.

Treasurer's Report: Tina Nord reported that the current cash balance is \$6771.

The Guild has received \$1660 in donations since May 1st. This is \$460 more than expected. We have also received \$550 in returned deposits that will show up on the final financial end of year report. Workshop expenses last year were approximately \$200 less than expected and we also received approximately \$150 in extra donations. The loss for the last financial year is approximately \$1000, \$900 to \$1000 less than anticipated. The accountant also may waive her \$300 fee.

The Jane Tenorio-Coscarelli workshop in June had a loss of \$56.73. The workshop was graciously hosted by Roberta Walley saving the Guild \$230 in room rental fees. The expenses for the Irena Bluhm workshop were discussed. There are currently six paid registrants. The workshop will be promoted again in the newsletter. Sally has contacted local guilds to advertise.

The bank resolution will be completed with Debbie Nussbaum added as a signatory on the account. The debit card may need to be updated.

Newsletter: Luann Jaffe requested items for the August newsletter as soon as possible.

Philanthropy: Sue Woods and Hilary Smith talked about the November Philanthropy workshop. Members have been asked to bring completed blocks and fabric to the August meeting. Scholarship students for the upcoming workshops were discussed. There will be a form at the meeting asking members to put forward potential recipients for future workshops. Sally suggested offering the scholarship to members of the Guild as a show of appreciation.

Programs: Sally, Roberta and Kathryn Pellman talked about Programming. Sally will supervise contracts and registration. Roberta will supervise venues and Kathryn will liaise with lecturers and teachers. Irena Bluhm will stay at Roberta's house and Sally will host a dinner. The responsibility of the Guild in regards to any extra time guest speakers are in Los Angeles was discussed.

The Studio Art Quilt Associates 'SAQA' will present a travelling trunk show at the August meeting. There will be a power point presentation of upcoming workshops. A feedback form will be available to help gauge interest in, or resistance to programs.

The Larene Smith September workshop is now open for registration. Workshops will open up at least three months in advance. At the August meeting workshops through the end of the year will be open, and Spring 2016 sign ups will be available at the October General Meeting.

The calendar of upcoming programs has been completed for 2016 and most of 2017. There are a lot of exciting and inspiring speakers lined up including Luke Haynes, our own Kathryn Pellman, Sylvia Davis, Jerry Granata, Lura Schwarz Smith, Cathie Hoover and Rami Kim.

Venues were discussed. The Veterans' Memorial Complex in Culver City will be used for the August workshop. Issues using this venue in the future include the parking and the expense. Roberta will discuss future availability with St. Andrews Church. Westwood Presbyterian Church has not yet confirmed for the November Philanthropy workshop. Suggestions for alternate venues will be requested in the newsletter and at the meeting.

It was confirmed that workshop fees would not exceed \$70.

A field trip to the Sacred Threads traveling show at the Fuller Theological Seminary in Pasadena, with a docent led tour may occur in February.

Other Guild Business: The Fabric Giveaway/Fundraiser will be held at the August Quarterly Meeting.

The next Executive Board meeting will be held at the home of Sally Wright on Saturday September 26th at 10am.

The meeting was adjourned at 11.45am.
