A View from the Sidelines

For the past six years, I've been lucky enough to go to the Empty Spools Seminars in Asilomar (Pacific Grove) with my friend **Sally Wright**. One year Sally took Esterita Austin. Sally used her own photograph of Wells Cathedral in England and assembled a lot of stone-colored fabric. Sally talked about how many little pieces were involved. At the same time, she appreciated Austin's technique of shadow and perspective. Imagine my surprise when Sally asked if I had any purple fabric with me (does April bring spring showers?) because Austin suggested that Sally use bright purples and greens and orange/reds in place of more realistic tones. I always wondered if Sally chose the title "Stairway to Heaven" before or after the rock 'n roll colors appeared.



Sally returned to Los Angeles with the basic quilt pieced and a fusing product holding things together. Wait! It turned out that the fusible hadn't performed well and some of those tiny pieces floated, moved, and caused headaches. It all got back together with the added bonus of Sally's expert machine quilting.

Next I knew, the quilt won awards in Santa Monica, Glendale, Ontario, Durham (NC), Herndon (VA), and made it to Houston in 2009. (I'm sure I've left some things out.) Then I was privileged to learn that Sally had been approached by *The Quilt Life* editor and asked to send the quilt to their editorial headquarters. It took a while, but when *The Quilt Life* themed their October 2012 issue "Architecture" you can see why they chose Sally's quilt to be their star.

This October issue is on the newsstands now. WQ members will find it very interesting. There is a centerfold of Lenore Crawford's master quilt, "Port of Cassis" which now resides in the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, Kentucky. Crawford will be WQ's main speaker at our February general meeting and she also teaches a workshop, "Fusing & Fabric Painting" which is featured on pages 70-73.

We want to thank *The Quilt Life* for all their fine WQ publicity: and special congratulations to **Sally Wright**.
