PROFESSIONAL MACHINE QUILTING - LOCAL STYLE

Over the past months, we've provided the names of Southern California professional machine quilters and a little information about their services.

Now it's time to feature two very local quilters, both members of Westside Quilters.

TANYA HELDMAN is based in West Los Angeles and does free-motion design quilting from her home under the catchy name, Free Range Quilting. Clients can either come to her home or she is willing to pick up quilts at various guild meetings, or minigroup meetings. She would consider accepting a quilt by mail but especially initially, she would prefer to meet each client personally.

Tanya approaches each quilt differently, depending on the design of the quilt and the requests of the maker/owner of the quilt top. Tanya does not use pantographs.

Tanya charges by the square inch.

Batting can be provided by Tanya or the client. Turnaround time really depends on the quilt and the needs of the client – an average might be 2 to 4 weeks.

A website is under construction for Free Range Quilting and soon samples of Tanya's work will be on display there. As Tanya says, "I'd rather be working on my quilts than working on the computer." In the meantime, you can contact Tanya at info@freerangequilting.com or tanyaheldman@gmail.com.

PERLA ROTHENBERG is a West Los Angeles resident with a machine quilting specialty of free motion quilting. She can of course do stitching in the ditch but usually customers rely on Perla's design choices. Perla has a degree in art from the University of Colorado and majored in drawing and watercolor.

Perla prefers that the quilt owner provide the batting. She is happy to accept and deliver quilts by mail although personal exchange is always best, especially in the beginning.

Perla charges per project depending on the work involved. The price includes thread, unless special thread is needed.

Turnaround time varies, but Perla tries to complete a project within a three-week period.

Because Perla uses a sit-down HQ16, she has to pin quilts together with the batting and backing. She is happy to receive pre-pinned, sprayed or basted quilts – it gets the job done that much faster and saves the customer time and money.

NINA'S QUILT BARN IN REDONDO BEACH IS NEW - AND OPEN NOW

Nina Anderson has graced the South Bay with a new quilt shop, Nina's Quilt Barn, at 2302 Artesia Boulevard (between Slauson and McKay, about 4 blocks east of the former Cotton Shop). There is ample parking behind the store. Hours are 10:00 AM to 6:00 PM Monday through Friday. The website is www.ninasquiltbarn.wordpress.com (still partly under construction), and the phone is 310/374-7222.

Nina describes her fabric as traditional. She carries such lines (and complete lines, not partial) as Berkeley Square, Alice Blue, and Pride and Purpose, plus several folk art lines, shirtings, florals, and '30s favorites. The store also includes a wall of patterns. Customers can participate in a discount purchase card.

Nina's Quilt Barn is a Janome dealer. Classes are already organized for April, May and June – come into the store for the complete calendar – and the website will catch up soon, too. The classroom, when available, can be rented by individuals. Check out the club atmosphere and informal group classes. Nina is a self-proclaimed "everything" quilter with a love of fabric.

Roosters are a big part of Nina's life and she's created a store to display many in her collection. Stop by!

THE TREASURE HUNT IN CARPINTERIA IS CLOSING

A truly sad turn of events. The popular Carpinteria quilt shop, The Treasure Hunt, is closing. The store is open now with everything at 30% off. It is expected that the doors will close for good by mid-June. (Their lease is up on July 1.)

We spoke with Kathy Huelskamp, the owner, and she expects to continue with online retail out of her Ventura warehouse after the physical Carpinteria store is closed. She will feature fabric from a select group of fabric designers, including Kaffe Fassett, and special yarn purveyors such as Berroco and Plymouth

and even roving. She will continue to own the name, The Treasure Hunt.

Kathy hopes to expand another online enterprise, Down the Rabbit Hole, which sells buttons, ribbons, and French-influenced embellishments.
