DIRECTIONS AND PARKING FOR ST. ALBAN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN WESTWOOD

St. Alban's Episcopal Church 580 Hilgard Avenue at Westholme Los Angeles, CA 90024

Meetings are in the downstairs Parish Hall of St. Alban's Episcopal Church, accessible without stairs from the parking lot through the playground gate and into the nursery door, then right into the Parish Hall.

<u>From the San Diego Freeway (I-405</u>): Exit at Wilshire Boulevard and drive east. Go north (left) on Gayley to Lindbrook, then turn right. Lindbrook merges into Hilgard (to the left). Continue to Hilgard and Westholme approximately 1/2 mile. <u>From Sunset Boulevard</u>: Turn south on Hilgard and proceed about 1 mile to Westholme (the second traffic signal from Sunset). <u>Bus service</u>: Contact MTA 1.800.COMMUTE, or Santa Monica Big Blue Bus 310.451-5444.

Carpools and Parking

We are aware that parking can be difficult at St. Alban's. So we encourage everyone to carpool. One suggestion: Coordinate a group to meet in the parking lot of the Federal building (access from either Veteran or Sepulveda just south of Wilshire Boulevard) and come over to the Church in one car.

The St. Alban's parking lot is behind the church. Enter from Westholme. Parking is not permitted on the side streets. Those with handicap placards can park on the side streets when signs posted specifically allow it.

Also available is full-day and metered parking in the UCLA parking structure across Hilgard Avenue from the Church. Short-term parking (1 to 10 hours) is available from the automated Parking Pay Station in Structure 2 accessed from Charles Young Drive (tum left at the light after you enter UCLA on Westholme). The second entrance is signposted for metered parking. *We will have a volunteer stationed at the Church to direct you, or you can ask at the UCLA Parking kiosk for directions.*

In her biography, *Lenore* writes: "After working in a medical laboratory and chemical research lab for many years, I decided to pursue art as a full-time endeavor. Creating art is my dream job. I now walk up to my studio in my attic and play with fabric and fabric paint for a "job"! Currently I am teaching my fusing/fabric painting using my patterns plus other techniques I use. Some of my artwork can be seen at my <u>Available Work</u> link." At our meeting, *Lenore* will talk about her own interpretation of fusing and fabric painting techniques she now uses to create art quilts with depth and color from patterns are taken in her taxeds.

painting techniques she now uses to create art quilts with depth and color from photographs she has taken in her travels. She will tell how she creates a piece from beginning to end and gives secrets she has learned on how to make your design a winner. She has won prizes with this new style of art quilting such as the Best Wall Quilt at the 2007 AQS Nashville Show and the 2011 Moda Best Wall Quilt at the AQS Show in Paducah for her "Port of Cassis" shown here.

Saturday, March 9 Civil War Era Hexagon Potholder Blocks Registration opens at February 9 General Meeting

Don is both a quilt artist and historian. He works almost exclusively with 19th Century reproduction fabrics and pieced quilt patterns, attempting to reproduce quilts American women made. Recognized as one of the nation's experts on Civil War soldiers' quilts, Don co-authored with **Pam Weeks**, *Civil War Quilts*. His new project is the National Iraq/Afghanistan Memorial Quilt Project in which he is assembling 8" potholder quilt blocks that honor the fallen soldiers of Iraq and Afghanistan into quilts similar to the Civil War Sanitary Commission quilts. Don and his co-author Pam Weeks have co-authored a book of their own entitled *Quilts for Union Soldiers*.

Using old quilting patterns in new ways, he hand pieces and quilts all his quilts, many quilts to honor fallen heroes, both historical and present-day. He has devoted much of his life since 2001 to honoring the sacrifice and service of people who lost their life due to a terrorist attack or through military service. His quilts are displayed in a variety of locations.

He is the founder and guiding force behind the ongoing *Home of the Brave Quilt Project* which delivers replica Civil War soldiers quilts to the families of the Fallen Heroes from Iraq and Afghanistan.

Don travels around the country sharing his knowledge and expertise with Guilds and other audiences. An exhibit of his Civil War soldiers' quilts will be featured at the International <u>Quilt Study Center</u> in Nebraska in 2013

Born in 1942 in Basel, Switzerland, *Ursula* studied at the Schule fur Gestaltung Basel (Basel School of Design) from 1961-1965, specializing in drawing and textile design. She taught color and textile design there from 1975-2001. Ursula has been making quilts since 1976 and has exhibited and taught extensively in Switzerland and abroad. She has completed commissioned textile works across Europe, including major works for churches and corporations. Her honors and prizes are too numerous to mention!

For Westside Quilters, Ursula will teach two separate workshops, each limited to 12 students. *"Curves and Movement"* teaches how to create curves and movement by stripes and similar long shapes. No drawing skills are required – Ursula will teach you to scribble-draw and sketch and use glue. You'll surprise yourself with how these color exercises can suddenly translate into quilt designs.

The second workshop, "Color Designs for Quilts" teaches you how to invent color designs by yourself or inspired by drawings, pictures or photos. You'll learn to compare composition possibilities (amount and display of color, for instance). You'll learn to pop up and to calm your color selections. You'll learn what Ursula means by "ish" colors. You'll learn to multiply, complete and enrich your fabric choices and to adapt your designs to traditional or invented blocks/formats.

FOCUS GROUPS—A NEW CONCEPT

At their last meeting, the Executive Board voted to introduce Focus Groups to our Quarterly Meetings.

These will be informal get-togethers that focus on a different area of quilting each meeting, and will be hosted by a WQ member experienced in the topic of the focus group. Hand Applique will be the topic for our Feb 9 meeting and *Madhu Mandavia* will be hosting the group.

Madhu will show some of her work, share her experience, answer questions and discuss ideas with other members who are also hand appliquers or who wish to get started on doing some of their own work. We anticipate that **Focus Groups** will further encourage communication_between members, bring together members with like interests, and provide an opportunity for members to informally share their work, finished or in progress. Perhaps they will lead to the formation of new mini-groups?

So, please bring your appliqué work with you on Saturday, Feb 9, and prepare to be inspired!



ALEX ANDERSON COMES TO WESTSIDE QUILTERS!

April 14th will be an exciting day! **Westside Quilters** is hosting *Alex Anderson* for a virtual trunk show and presentation. *Alex* has become a world famous quilter, teacher, author, TV hostess, and magazine editor since she discovered quilting in 1978. That was when she finished her grandmother's *Grandmother's Flower Garden* quilt to complete graduation requirements at San Francisco

State University. It didn't quite become a queen size quilt as she had dreamed, more of a bath mat size quilt, but it did introduce quilting as a way to use her artistic talents, and Alex's original thoughts of becoming a weaver were no more.

In the same year, **Alex** happened upon a quilt show in Oakland, CA that opened her eyes

to quilts as a form of art. Then, she discovered a vibrant quilt guild--<u>The East Bay Heritage Quilters</u>--and became a member of a mini-group called "Strings." Like many of us, she discovered mentors and friendship in this group.

Since then, Alex has followed many paths that quilting has offered her. She loves the look and feel of hand quilting, but she machine quilts with the best, excels at hand and machine appliqué, paper piecing and redwork. Alex hosted the TV series <u>Simply Quilts</u> for 11 years and now is co-editor of American Quilter's Society's <u>The Quilt</u> <u>Life Magazine</u>.

What a delicious variety of experiences: And she is going to share them with Westside Quilters! Come, and bring your friends to an afternoon with **Alex Anderson** including a presentation and trunk show on **Sunday, April 14, 2013** from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. at the *University Synagogue in Brentwood*.

A Report from the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds Sally Wright, VP and SCCQG Representative

Very, very early on a very, very cold January 12, I drove down the 405 for the **Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds** meeting hosted by El Camino quilters in the San Diego county foothills near San Marcos. The meeting room (unfortunately unheated!) was in a county equestrian and sports park in a wonderfully picturesque Southern California setting. Dressage riders trotted by and families were gathered for soccer games beneath the eucalyptus.

The business meeting highlighted some proposed changes to the SCCQG by-laws that will enact term limits for officers and hopefully allow proxy voting in the future. Our region is so far flung that sometimes it is difficult to get a quorum for the quarterly meetings, and it is hoped that proxy voting might help. These changes to the by-laws will be voted on at the next meeting in April. New SCCQG president **Pam Overton** chaired her first meeting and said that her top priority is to improve communications between the council and member guilds as well as among the member guilds themselves.

Speaking of the next SCCQG meeting, it will be a repeat

of the new *Meet the Teachers* format introduced last year. It will be held on Saturday, April 13, again at the Carson Community Center, in a mini quilt show format, with speaker booths and vendors. Admission is free for everyone, so plan on going and bringing your quilting friends!

The discussion topic of this past meeting was how to draw new members into guild membership and retain them. It was agreed that an open and friendly atmosphere is essential, and many good ideas were shared by the SCCQG program chair **Patti Voyles** and various guild reps. I brought back some of those ideas and some may be enacted by our Board in the coming months.

My beautiful afternoon in San Diego continued after the meeting with a visit to the Poway Center for the Performing Arts. There I visited the <u>SAQA exhibit</u> "Creative Inspiration" which included some work by our own members, followed by a quick stop at the <u>Oceanside Museum of Art</u> to see the traveling exhibit from Quilt National.

Wounded Warrior Quilt?

May 1, 2012

Haag, eyes still closed, reached his hand out to shake hands with the President. 'I'll never forget that moment,' someone else in the room later told me."

Knitting in Recovery – One Stitch at a Time
