Quilting what an incredible art form, utilitarian to the sublime, by hand or machine, as simple as sewing a few squares of different colors together to unique expressions of who we are, how we see the world, our passion and our skill set. My favorite part of Westside Quilters quarterly meetings is Show & Tell. I love everyone's quilts, the variety, colors, patterns and techniques always delight me. Speaking of being delighted, a friend has been sharing her creative quilting journey with me, as she assembles an original design king size quilt. Months ago she shared her color palette. She auditioned various solid fabrics that embraced an analogous color scheme. Her concept of circles and rectangles takes basic shapes and arranges them into a challenging and unique design. We got together the other day, the top and back are done and it's all stretched on her quilting frame, yes, she quilts by hand. Each stitch is part of the design concept. She asked, so I added my two cents to add a lighter value top stitch thread color in areas to make things pop and bring the eye around the design. Variation of scale, rhythm, repetition, color, line all words from the art world are all represented

in her quilt. I'm looking forward to our next visit, can't wait to see the finished quilt.
