PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Coincidental Learning

A week's workshop with Australian quilter Jenny Bowker on Middle Eastern tiles taught me a lot about repetitive design and appliqué, but what I really retained was her offhand instruction for quick half-square triangles (8 from two 12" squares). A Sylvia Davis workshop had me sitting next to a new quilter who shared an organizational idea using anchor cloths when chain-piecing. At one WQ workshop, a quilter taught me how to use features of my own sewing machine.

Quilting can be a solitary or social activity. Both have their charms. Alone, there's NPR or Turner Classic Movies or Books-on-Tape. Together, you might have a quilting buddy, a minigroup (or two), guild meetings, quilt shows, and instruction of all kinds. It is the workshop that has provided the most coincidental learning in my quilting life.

In an all-day workshop, teachers have time to tell stories and digress. Charlotte Angotti, famous for mystery quilt work-shops, is a captivating Southern raconteur. She taught me to rhyme a little when assembling complicated blocks. A fellow quilter taught me to use blue masking tape to keep cut pieces in order. Ruth McDowell described how she solved problems in her quilts (making her extraordinarily human) and recommends using a mechanical pencil. Others shared what *not to do* in selecting subjects for quilts.

Coming up for WQ is Natalie Barnes "No Rule(r)s" workshop on March 14. This will be a rapid-fire technique class for all skill levels.



Consider it a refresher class or a learning glossary. I'm expecting that with methods and tricks floating in the air, students in the class will be offering their own and everyone will benefit. More coincidental learning.

Since 2008 she has been marketing Beyond the Reef full time, designing patterns and is looking to design fabric lines in the future.



Non-Profit Status Westside Quilters is tax-exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and classified as a public charity under section 170 of the Code, according to the determination letter dated May 26, 2011 received from the Internal Revenue Service.
