3rd ANNUAL GIVING FOR THANKSGIVING WORKSHOP

Is your calendar marked for Westside Quilter's free philanthropy workshop on Saturday, November 8? It will be a great and productive day as we assemble child size quilts that will be distributed through the following local charities: Las Familias del Pueblo, Para Los Ninos and Saint Joseph Center.

We are ambitiously machine quilting all the quilts this year. Thank you to all of you who took packets of fabric squares to assemble tops. When assembled, please arrange to get the tops to either Tanya or Debbie both reachable via Philanthropy@WestsideQuiltersLosAngeles.org. In turn, we're doing our best to get the tops machine quilted prior to the workshop. It's also okay to bring tops to the workshop as we will do some actual domestic machine



quilting there. However, quilting can be time consuming, so the more quilts we get past this point prior to the workshop, the better!

WHEN: Saturday, November 8 9:30 am — 3:30 pm

WHERE: Westwood Presbyterian 10822 Wilshire Blvd., 90024 (entrance of Ashton Ave., one block

south of Wilshire Blvd.)

Workshop Plan!!!

Pick any of the stations you would like to work at and help us by bringing the needed supplies. We can also use fabric for binding. If you have bright solid fabric you can spare, this would be a good time to bring it. We are planning to have the following stations to complete the quilts:

<u>PIN BASTING</u> – Some tops will arrive at the workshop not yet quilted. These will all be rather small quilts, so we will need some people to pin baste. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Pins for basting.

<u>QUILTING</u> – For those comfortable with quilting small quilts on your home machine, please come ready with whatever you need to help us with this part of the process. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Sewing machines, walking foot, gloves and thread.

<u>MAKING BINDING</u> – This part of the process will involve cutting, sewing and ironing. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Cutting board, rotary cutters, iron and ironing board or other ironing surface, sewing machine and thread.

<u>SEWING BINDING TO QUILTS</u> – We will bind the quilts we complete in the workshop by machine. Hand sewing binding to the back of quilts is very time consuming and will limit the number of quilts we'll be able to complete during our workshop. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Sewing Machine, thread.

<u>IRONING</u> – We are mentioning this as a separate part of the process because we really need enough people and irons to have the most productive workshop possible. Although last year's workshop was a success, we could have been more productive if we had more up and running ironing stations. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Irons and ironing boards or other ironing surfaces.

ATTACHING WQ LABELS – This will require hand sewing. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Hand sewing needles and thread.

We welcome additional kid friendly fabrics and batting for the workshop. Depending on supplies on hand at the start of the workshop, we will start as many quilts as possible at cutting and piecing stations.

Currently, I'm making ornaments to support a U.S. troop organization. My deadline is November 7 -- so forgive me but I need to get back to my crafting.....

The general meeting of Westside Quilters (WQ) was held on October 24, 2014 at St. John's Presbyterian Church.

Introductory Remarks: President Perla Rothenberg brought the meeting to order at 10:00 am welcoming everyone. Laurie Brainerd was introduced as a new member.

Minutes: A motion to pass the minutes of the August 14, 2014 meeting was made by Jennie Kraft and seconded by Luann Jaffe.

Guild Business:

Philanthropy: Tanya Heldman & Debbie Nussbaum talked about the November 8th philanthropy workshop. The workshop will be held at Westwood Presbyterian Church on Wilshire Blvd. It will focus on quilts for children's charities. Sign up sheets were available for specific tasks. It was requested that members bring equipment for the tasks, irons, rotary cutters etc.

Luanne Jaffe, a Sylvia Davis workshop Ribbons quilt. Virginia Marshall, "Flutterby." Kathryn Pellman showed a collection of snapshot and postcard sized 'fashionista' pieces. Laurie Brainerd showed "To the Brim."

Featured Speaker:

Our featured speaker Lisa Coulombe was introduced. Lisa is a quilter who, once she ran out of beds and walls for her quilts, turned to wearable art. She has over 20 years of experience and calls herself a "technique junkie." She has now nearly filled her closets with approximately 110 jackets and coats. Lisa led us through her quilting history, including the inspirations found while living in Thailand and Bahrain. She showed us some of her techniques using flannel as a foundation, piecing, quilting and then cutting the patterns. She also talked about and showed her use of flanges, beading and stenciling the inside lining. A great fashion show followed with many of Lisa's beautiful pieces modeled by some of our members.

The member Holiday Tea will be held on Saturday December 6 at the home of Roberta Walley. The next General Meeting will be held on February 7, 2015.

Perla thanked Lisa and the meeting was adjourned at 11:45.

Road to California Atrium Exhibit January 2014 Entry Form

Westside Quilters has been selected to show quilts in the annual Quilt Guild Exhibit quilts in the atrium of the Ontario Convention Center during Road to California January 22-25, 2015. We need 35 quilts all of which are at least 72" long. Width can vary and is not critical. The quilts are hung from the upper level and provide a wonderful view as you enter the Convention Center.

All quilts must have a 4" hanging sleeve attached and each quilt needs to be labeled with the Quilter's name and Phone number. Please put the labels on the top right hand side (on the back of the quilt) near the sleeve. The Road to California organizers encourage you to name your quilts, it makes for a more interesting exhibit. All quilt tops must have been made by a WQ Member. There is no "Made after" date requirement. All quilt styles are welcome!

All the entry forms must be returned by **November 1**, but we don't need the actual quilts until January 10th. Get your entries in early – If we receive more entries than the 35 we need, there will be some very informal jury process to provide the best and most varied showcase of our talented WQ Members. Earlier entries may get priority. Please include a photo (at least 4" X 6") of each quilt along with your entry form. Photos can just be a snapshot – they are for our use only and will not be published. Each quilt requires its own separate form.
