I had two bright fat quarter packs which I used to cut out blocks for two quilts: a square-in-a-square, and from the leftovers I was able to make enough blades to make five Dresden plate blocks. Now I just have to decide on my background fabric. I'd like to do a "modern" version but nothing has come to mind yet. At least my plates are ready to go when it does.

Ann Turley's workshop "Making Faces" was a lot of fun. I hope to finish mine and show it at our show and tell portion of our October 18 guild meeting. I hope others in the class bring theirs as well—we can have a reunion of sorts!

I have one quilt ready to go for our Philanthropy workshop scheduled for Nov. 8, and two more are in the works. I hope everyone will be able to turn in at least one quilt to donate to Para Los Niños, Las Familias Del Pueblo, and/or St. Joseph Center. More information about these charities are on our website. Let's all do our part to deliver at least one quilt to our Nov. 8 charity event! See you there.

PHILANTHROPY

3rd ANNUAL GIVING FOR THANKSGIVING WORKSHOP

Saturday, November 8th is the date for the free philanthropy workshop, "Giving for Thanksgiving." The workshop is from 9:30am to 3:30pm, and will be held at Westwood Presbyterian Church, 10822 Wilshire Blvd., Los Angeles, 90024.

We hope you have your calendars marked! It will be an entertaining and productive day as we assemble quilts for children. The children's charities we're targeting are Las Familias del Pueblo, Para Los Niños and Saint Joseph Center. The Saint Joseph Center wants quilts that are40" x 52". Para Los Niños wants quilts that are 36" x 46 ". However, Las Familias and Para Los Niños have families in need of children's quilts of all sizes.



PLAN FOR THE WORKSHOP

We are planning to have the following stations to complete the quilts:

<u>PIN BASTING</u> - Some tops will arrive at the workshop that have not yet been quilted. These will all be rather small quilts, so we will need some people to pin baste. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Pins for basting.

<u>QUILTING</u> - For those of you comfortable with quilting small quilts on your home machine, please come ready with whatever you need to help us with this part of the process. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Sewing machine, walking foot, gloves and thread.

<u>MAKING BINDING</u> - This part of the process with involve sewing and ironing. If you have solid fabric you can spare, this would be a good time to bring that in. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Cutting board, rotary cutters, iron and ironing board or other ironing surface, sewing machine and thread.

<u>SEWING BINDING ON QUILTS</u> - We are planning to have the binding for the quilts we complete in the workshop to be sewn by machine. Hand sewing the binding to the back of the quilts is way too time consuming and will limit the number of quilts we'll be able to complete during our workshop. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Sewing machine, thread

I<u>RONING</u> - We are mentioning this as a separate part of the process because we really need enough people and irons to have the most productive workshop possible. Although our last workshop was a success, we could have been more productive if we had more up and running ironing stations. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Irons and ironing boards or other ironing surface.

ATTACHING WESTSIDE QUILTERS LABLES - This part will require hand sewing. I hope to have some of the quilts with labels sewn onto the backs prior to quilting, but this won't always be the case. SUPPLIES REQUIRED: Hand sewing needles and thread.

At the next WQ general meeting, OCTOBER 18th, there will be sign-up sheets for the various workshop stations, with lists of what to bring. Please stop by the table and sign up.

Additional Philanthropy Goal

Did you know WQ provides scholarships to workshops? If you know anyone not in the guild that might like, or would benefit from, a particular class, please let us know. They can be a youngster, neighbor or teacher; it's a wonderful way to introduce people to quilting and our guild.

WESTSIDE QUILTERS EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING - SEPTEMBER 27, 2014

A meeting of the Executive Board of Westside Quilters was held on September 27th, 2014 at the home of Sally Wright.

President Perla Rothenberg called the meeting to order at 10:15. Other officers attending were Sally Wright, Tanya Heldman and Lisa Drew.

The motion to approve the minutes of the July 26th meeting was made by Sally Wright, seconded by Tanya Heldman, and approved.

President's Report: Perla talked about the successful LDS Quilt Exhibit. The Board thanked Perla for all of her hard work coordinating the exhibit.

The Holiday Tea was discussed. The suggested date is Saturday December 6th. The venue is not confirmed yet. A request for ideas of which local community groups to donate to this year will be in the newsletter.

Vice President's Report: The Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds meeting will be held on October 11th. Roberta Walley will be out of town. Sally Wright may be able to attend. Perla will be there.

Membership Report: Sally Wright reported that there are now 86 guild members. Sally will not be able to attend the October quarterly meeting and asked for someone to take her place at the membership table.

Options for assisting with the set up of Mini Groups were discussed. It was decided that there will not be a break away session at the Philanthropy workshop.

Sally reported that there are 20 entries for Road to California so far. 35 quilts are needed. Paperwork and photos should be submitted to Sally as soon as possible.

Treasurer's Report: Tina sent the following report to the meeting: Cash balance: \$7,681.52. The Culver City Vets Memorial Complex is holding a refundable deposit of \$325.00.

The Laurel Anderson workshop in August had 8 paid registrants and resulted in a loss of \$495. The Ann Turley workshop had 15 paid registrants and a loss of \$57.

In October, we need to pay \$1,450+ in expenses: Annual SCCQG fee (\$350+) and our CPA for tax preparation services (\$300). Also, we'll have the expense of a quarterly speaker (estimated \$800).

In May we donated \$200 to the Veterans Home of California for their generosity in letting us use one of their residence dining rooms for our Jane Sassaman workshop. (They offered it to us at no charge.) This check has not been cashed. Finally this week we ascertained that the check should be considered lost and a replacement check will be issued.

The Board should be advised that our SCCQG liability insurance is a valuable asset. For the equivalent of \$350+ (see above reference to the annual fee) we are able to get low-cost liability insurance. Without liability insurance, most venues would not accept us. If they did accept us without insurance, the entire WQ membership would be "severely liable" in the case of a lawsuit for an accident or injury.

Newsletter: The deadline for the October newsletter is September 30th.

Philanthropy: Tanya Heldman talked about the November 8th Philanthropy workshop. Tanya requested help with the quilting both ahead of time and at the workshop. Tanya will talk at the quarterly meeting about what is needed for the workshop.

Programs: The Veterans' Memorial Center was an ideal location for workshops and can be reserved for the year ahead. Issues with Insurance paperwork and deposit checks were noted.

The Lisa Coulombe workshop may have to be cancelled due to the current number of registrants.

Sign-up sheets for interest in the 2015 workshops will be available at the October meeting.

The next Executive Board meeting will be held at Sally Wright's home on November 15, 2014.

The meeting was adjourned at 11.10.

Get your entries in early – If we receive more entries than the 35 we need, there will be some very informal jury process to provide the best and most varied showcase of our talented WQ Members. Earlier entries may get priority. Please include a photo (at least 4" X 6") of each quilt along with your entry form. Photos can just be a snapshot – they are for our use only and will not be published. Each quilt requires its own separate form.
