In her biography, *Lenore* writes: "After working in a medical laboratory and chemical research lab for many years, I decided to pursue art as a full-time endeavor. Creating art is my dream job. I now walk up to my studio in my attic and play with fabric and fabric paint for a "job"! Currently I am teaching my fusing/fabric painting using my patterns plus other techniques I use. Some of my artwork can be seen at my Available Work link."

At our meeting, *Lenore* will talk about her own interpretation of fusing and fabric painting techniques she now uses to create art quilts with depth and color from photographs she has taken in her travels. She will tell how she creates a piece from beginning to end and gives secrets she has learned on how to make your design a winner. She has won prizes with this new style of art quilting such as the Best Wall Quilt at the 2007 AQS Nashville Show and the 2011 Moda Best Wall Quilt at the AQS Show in Paducah for her "Port of Cassis" shown here.
